Proverbs 18:21· Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and he that is loving it will eat its fruitage.

[13] - References

- The mouth of the righteous one, it bears the fruit of wisdom, but the **tongue** of perverseness **will** be cut off. (**Proverbs 10:31**)
- The **fruitage** of the righteous one is a tree of **life**, and he that is winning souls is wise. (**Proverbs 11:30**)
- However, the things proceeding out of the mouth come out of the heart, and those things defile a man. (**Matthew 15:18**)
- Let a rotten saying not proceed out of **YOUR** mouth, but whatever saying is good for building up as the need may be, that it may impart what is favorable to the hearers. (**Ephesians 4:29**)
- Well, the **tongue** is a fire. The **tongue** is constituted a world of unrighteousness among our members, for it spots up all the body and sets the wheel of natural **life** aflame and it is set aflame by Gehenna. (**James 3:6**)
- To earthling man belong the arrangements of the heart, but from Yehowah is the answer of the **tongue**. (**Proverbs 16:1**)
- The words of the mouth of the wise one mean favor, but the lips of the stupid one swallow him up. (**Ecclesiastes 10:12**)
- I am creating the fruit of the lips. Continuous peace there **will** be to the one that is far away and to the one that is near, Yehowah has said, and I **will** heal him. (**Isaiah 57:19**)
- Through him let us always offer to God a sacrifice of praise, that is, the fruit of lips which make public declaration to his name. (**Hebrews 13:15**)
