Proverbs 18:21^{..} Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and he that is loving it will eat its fruitage.

• To earthling man belong the arrangings of the heart, but from Yehowah is the answer of the tongue. (Proverbs 16:1)

• The words of the mouth of the wise one mean favor, but the lips of the stupid one swallow him up. (Ecclesiastes 10:12)
