Ezekiel 18:22... All his transgressions that he has committed, they will not be remembered against him. For his righteousness that he has done he will keep living.

And let them cover themselves with sackcloth, man and domestic animal, and let them call out to God with strength and come back, each one from his bad way and from the violence that was in their hands. (Jonah 3:8)

• Who is there knowing whether the true God may turn back and actually feel regret and turn back from his burning anger, so that we may not perish? (Jonah 3:9)

• And the true God got to see their works, that they had turned back from their bad way, and so the true God felt regret over the calamity that he had spoken of causing to them, and he did not cause it. (Jonah 3:10)

• All this I have seen, and there was an applying of my heart to every work that has been done under the sun, during the time that man has dominated man to his injury. (Ecclesiastes 8:9)

Does not behave indecently, does not look for its own interests, does not become provoked. It does not keep account of the injury. (1 Corinthians 13:5)

• Look out for the dogs, look out for the workers of injury, look out for those who mutilate the flesh. (Philippians 3:2)

See that no one renders injury for injury to anyone else, but always pursue what is good toward one another and to all others. (1 Thessalonians 5:15) • Not paying back injury for injury or reviling for reviling, but, to the contrary, bestowing a blessing, because you were called to this course, so that you might inherit a blessing. (1 Peter 3:9)

• And he kept praying to Him, so that He let himself be entreated by him and He heard his request for favor and restored him to Jerusalem to his kingship, and Manasseh came to know that Yehowah is the true God. (2 Chronicles 33:13)

• The sins of my youth and my revolts O do not remember. According to your loving-kindness do you yourself remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O Yehowah. (Psalms 25:7)

I, I am the One that is wiping out your transgressions for my own sake, and your sins I shall not remember. (Isaiah 43:25)

• None of his sins with which he has sinned will be remembered against him. Justice and righteousness are what he has carried on. He will positively keep living. (Ezekiel 33:16)
