 Men … Righteous … Trust - Roll upon Yehowah your way and trust him to act for you (Psalms 37:5) <sup>[19] - References</sup>

Psalms 37:5<sup>...</sup> Roll upon Yehowah your way, and rely upon him, and he himself will act.

Throw your burden upon Yehowah himself, and he himself will sustain you. Never will he allow the righteous one to totter. (Psalms 55:22)

• Roll your works upon Yehowah himself and your plans will be firmly established. (Proverbs 16:3)

• Keep on, then, seeking first the kingdom and his righteousness, and all these other things will be added to you. (Matthew 6:33)

Do not be anxious over anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication along with thanksgiving let YOUR petitions be made known to God. (Philippians 4:6)

• While you throw all your anxiety upon him, because he cares for you. (1 Peter 5:7)
