Psalms 37:35... I have seen the wicked a tyrant and spreading himself as a luxuriant tree in native soil.

- And Haman proceeded to declare to them the glory of his riches and the large number of his sons and everything with which the king had magnified him and how he had exalted him over the princes and the servants of the king. (Esther 5:11)
- Why is it that the wicked themselves keep living, have grown old, also have become superior in wealth? (Job 21:7)
- I myself have seen the foolish one taking root, but suddenly I began to execrate his abiding place. (Job 5:3)
- He is full of sap before the sun, and in his garden his own twig goes forth. (Job 8:16)
- The tents of the despoilers are unworried, and the ones enraging God have the safety belonging to one who has brought a god in his hand. (Job 12:6)
- Look! These are the wicked, who are at ease indefinitely. They have increased their means of maintenance. (Psalms 73:12)
- When the wicked ones sprout as the vegetation and all the practicers of what is hurtful blossom forth, it is that they may be annihilated forever. (Psalms 92:7)
- Who say; Our sons are like little plants grown up in their youth, our daughters like corners carved in palace style. (Psalms 144:12)
- That is why it grew higher in its stature than all the other trees of the field. And its boughs kept multiplying, and its branches continued getting longer because of much water in its watercourses. (Ezekiel 31:5)
