

**Micah 4:11~** **And now there will certainly be gathered against you many nations, those who are saying; Let her be polluted, and may our eyes look upon Zion.**

**1· Now there will come up against her many nations who will be saying; Let he be polluted, and may our eyes look upon Zion, as if to say, let us see her destruction, for she is not better than any other nation. Though this had a first fulfillment upon the Jews in 607 B.C.E, at the hands of the Babylonians, it also has a Messianic application at the war of Har-mageddon.**

**[Question]** Who would certainly come upon against Zion then, and what would they want to see happen to her, for how would they view her?

**[Question]** What applications has this prophecy seen, and will yet see?

**2· At you all your enemies have opened their mouth. They have whistled and kept grinding the teeth. They have said; We will swallow her down. This indeed is the day that we have hoped for. We have found! We have seen! (Lamentations 2:16)**

**[Question]** How did the Babylonians feel, when the city of Jerusalem was given into their hands?

**3· And you ought not to watch the sight in the day of your brother, in the day of his misfortune, and you ought not to rejoice at the sons of Judah, in the day of their perishing, and you ought not to maintain a big mouth in the day of their distress. (Obadiah 1:12)**

**[Question]** How should men not come to feel then, for who is watching all their ways?

**4· And my enemy will see, and shame will cover her, who was saying to me; Where is he, Yehowah your God? My own eyes will look upon her. Now she will become a place of trampling, like the mire of streets. (Micah 7:10)**

**[Question]** How did Yehowah God show how his people would then triumph over those seeking her destruction?

**5· Remember, O Yehowah, regarding the sons of Edom, the day of Jerusalem, who were saying; Lay it bare! Lay it**

**bare to the foundation within it! (Psalms 137:7)**

**[Question]** How did the sons of Edom act when Jerusalem fell, and who took note of it?

- 6· **Be injurious, O you peoples, and be shattered to pieces, and give ear, all you in distant parts of the earth! Gird yourselves, and be shattered to pieces! Gird yourselves, and be shattered to pieces! (Isaiah 8:9)**

**[Question]** How did Isaiah show, that these nations would fare, if they then took up the fight against Yehowah God's people?

- 7· **Though he may not be that way, he will feel inclined, though his heart may not be that way, he will scheme, because to annihilate is in his heart, and to cut off nations not a few. (Isaiah 10:7)**

**[Question]** How did Isaiah show, what is in the heart of the enemies of Jerusalem?

- 8· **For this is what Yehowah of armies has said; Following after the glory, he has sent me to the nations that were despoiling you people, for he that is touching you is touching my eyeball. (Zechariah 2:8)**

**[Question]** How did Zechariah show, how Yehowah God feels about any nation that comes against his people?

- 9· **And it must occur in that day that I shall make Jerusalem a burdensome stone to all the peoples. All those lifting it, will without fail get severe scratches for themselves, and against her, all the nations of the earth will certainly be gathered. (Zechariah 12:3)**

**[Question]** What would Yehowah God then make Jerusalem to all the peoples of the earth?

**[Question]** Against whom then, would all the nations of the earth be gathered?

- 10· **And this is what will prove to be the scourge with which Yehowah will scourge all the peoples that will actually do military service against Jerusalem. There will be a rotting away of one's flesh, while one is standing upon one's feet, and one's very eyes will rot away in their sockets, and one's very tongue will rot away in one's mouth. (Zechariah**

**14:12)**
