- Micah 6:7~ Will Yehowah be pleased with thousands of rams, with tens of thousands of torrents of oil? Shall I give my firstborn son for my revolt, the fruitage of my belly for the sin of my soul?
 - 1. Micah postulates, whether even thousands of rams and tens of thousands of torrents of oil would please him, or even be adequate for him? Could Micah give his own firstborn son, as a payment for his own revolt against God? Would the fruitage of his own belly be adequate to cover his own sin?
 - [Question] What further postulation does Micah make, as to what might please Yehowah God?
 - 2. For to me belongs every wild animal of the forest, the beasts upon a thousand mountains. (Psalms 50:10)
 - [Question] Who do all the wild animals of the earth belong, and could Yehowah God take any of them, if he wanted something to eat?
 - 3. For you do not take delight in sacrifice, otherwise I would give it, in whole burnt offering you do not find pleasure.

 (Psalms 51:16)
 - [Question] What did Yehowah God show, that he did not take any delight in?
 - 4. And you would take your embroidered garments and cover them, and my oil and my incense you would actually put before them. (Ezekiel 16:18)
 - [Question] How did the Israelites use even his holy items in false worship?
 - 5. Finally he took his firstborn son who was going to reign in place of him, and offered him up as a burnt sacrifice upon the wall. And there came to be great indignation against Israel, so that they pulled away from against him, and returned to their land. (2 Kings 3:27)
 - [Question] What did a later king of Moab do, that disgusted the people?
 - 6. Not one of them can by any means redeem even a brother, nor give to God a ransom for him. (Psalms 49:7)

[Question] What did the Psalmist show, that no man can offer in behalf of another?

7. And the redemption price of their soul is so precious, that it has ceased to time indefinite. (Psalms 49:8)

[Question] What is the value of the redemption price of the human family?

8. And you would take your sons and your daughters whom you had borne to me, and you would sacrifice these to them to be devoured, is that not enough of your acts of prostitution? (Ezekiel 16:20)

[Question] How did Yehowah God view it, when his children were sacrificed to idols of the nations?

9. I will not take out of your house a bull, out of your pens hegoats. (Psalms 50:9)

[Question] What did the Israelites not want to continue giving to God, but what did they fail to recognize about the costliness of all sin?

10" To carry on righteousness and judgment, is more preferable to Yehowah than sacrifice. (Proverbs 21:3)

[Question] What is more preferable than sacrifice in Yehowah God's eyes?

11. For it is not possible for the blood of bulls and of goats, to take sins away. (Hebrews 10:4)

[Question] What is it not possible for the blood of bulls and goats, to take away from men?
