

**Micah 7:7~ But as for me, it is for Yehowah that I shall keep on the lookout. I will show a waiting attitude for the God of my salvation. My God will hear me.**

**1· Yet Micah shows, that it is to his God that he will keep looking. He will show a waiting attitude toward Yehowah God and his glorious promises, for Yehowah is the God of all salvation. He says; My God will hear me!**

**[Question]** What though, did Micah show that he would patiently wait for, and what confidence did he possess in his God, his faith?

**2· Likewise today in this time of the end Yehowah God's people must keep a waiting attitude, and not lose their faith in the glorious promises of Yehowah God, for Yehowah God will indeed hear the pleadings of his faithful ones, and bring salvation and protection from these wicked ones.**

**[Question]** What also must God's people keep today, and why?

**3· They looked to him and became radiant, and their very faces could not possibly be ashamed. (Psalms 34:5)**

**[Question]** What will God's people not become of they maintain faith in him always?

**4· Look! As the eyes of servants are toward the hand of their master, as the eyes of a maidservant are toward the hand of her mistress, so our eyes are toward Yehowah our God, until he shows us favor. (Psalms 123:2)**

**[Question]** Who did the Psalmist look to for support and assistance?

**5· And I will keep in expectation of Yehowah, who is concealing his face from the house of Jacob, and I will hope in him. (Isaiah 8:17)**

**[Question]** What did Isaiah state, that he would keep in expectation of, and hope in?

**6· I shall indeed wait for salvation from you, O Yehowah. (Genesis 49:18)**

**[Question]** What did Jacob prophesy that Dan, meaning judge, would wait for from his God?

- 7· **Make me walk in your truth and teach me, for you are my God of salvation. In you I have hoped all day long. (Psalms 25:5)**

**[Question]** What did the Psalmist want to learn and walk in always, for who did he hope in daily?

- 8· **Indeed toward God is my soul waiting in silence. From him my salvation is. (Psalms 62:1)**

**[Question]** Who did the Psalmist keep waiting for, for salvation?

- 9· **Good it is that one should wait, even silently, for the salvation of Yehowah. (Lamentations 3:26)**

**[Question]** How did Jeremiah feel, even through the terrible events of the fall of Jerusalem?

- 10· **And, look! There was a man in Jerusalem named Simeon, and this man was righteous and reverent, waiting for Israel's consolation, and Holy Spirit was upon him. (Luke 2:25)**

**[Question]** Who came forward to prophesy about the baby Jesus, and what was he waiting for, and what was upon him?

- 11· **So take knowledge that Yehowah will certainly distinguish his loyal one, Yehowah himself will hear when I call to him. (Psalms 4:3)**

**[Question]** What did the Psalmist know, that Yehowah God would distinguish?

- 12· **I earnestly hoped in Yehowah, and so he inclined his ear to me and heard my cry for help. (Psalms 40:1)**

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist feel about his God, and so what did his God do for him?

- 13· **O Hearer of prayer, even to you people of all flesh will come. (Psalms 65:2)**

**[Question]** What is Yehowah God toward all peoples, and so who will come to be drawn to him?

- 14· **Look! God is my salvation. I shall trust and be in no dread, for Yah, Yehowah is my strength and my might, and he**

came to be the **salvation** of me. (**Isaiah 12:2**)

**[Question]** How did Isaiah feel, in the loving care of his loyal God?

15· And in that day one **will** certainly say; Look! This is our **God**. We have hoped in him, and he **will** save us. This is Yehowah. We have hoped in him. Let us be joyful and rejoice in the **salvation** by him. (**Isaiah 25:9**)

**[Question]** What did Isaiah prophesy then men would come to say about Yehowah God, in the day of salvation?

16· And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that, no matter what it is that we ask according to his **will**, he **hears** us. (**1 John 5:14**)

**[Question]** What confidence did John express in all his prayers and requests made before Yehowah God?

17· One who is a laughingstock to his fellowman I become, one calling to **God**, that he should answer him. A laughingstock is the righteous, unblamable one. (**Job 12:4**)

**[Question]** What did Job bemoan, that he had become to his fellow man?

18· Be courageous, and may **YOUR** heart be strong, all **YOU** who are **waiting** for Yehowah. (**Psalms 31:24**)

**[Question]** How should all those waiting for Yehowah God's salvation feel?

19· Let your loving-kindness, O Yehowah, prove to be upon us, even as we have kept **waiting** for you. (**Psalms 33:22**)

**[Question]** How did David wait for Yehowah God, and for his loving-kindness upon him?

20· Why are you in despair, O my soul, and why are you boisterous within me? Wait for **God**, for I shall yet laud him, as the grand **salvation** of my person. (**Psalms 42:5**)

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist feel in his circumstance, yet what did he decide to wait for?

21· Indeed toward **God** wait silently, O my soul, because from him is my hope. (**Psalms 62:5**)

**[Question]** What did the Psalmist show that he would wait silently for, for who was his hope?

- 22· For your **salvation** my soul has pined away, for your word I have waited. (**Psalms 119:81**)

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist express his waiting attitude for Yehowah God?

- 23· My soul has waited for Yehowah more than watchmen for the morning, watching for the morning. (**Psalms 130:6**)

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist illustrate, how his soul had waited for Yehowah God?

- 24· Let Israel wait for Yehowah from now on and to time indefinite. (**Psalms 131:3**)

**[Question]** How did the Psalmist show, who Israel should wait for?

- 25· In that day earthling man **will** look up to his Maker, and his own eyes **will** gaze at the Holy One of Israel himself. (**Isaiah 17:7**)

**[Question]** What did Isaiah prophesy Israel would look to, in time?

- 26· Yes, for the path of your judgments, O Yehowah, we have hoped in you. For your name and for your memorial, the desire of the soul has been. (**Isaiah 26:8**)

**[Question]** What had Israel hoped for?

- 27· Turn to me and be saved, all **you** at the ends of the earth, for I am **God**, and there is no one else. (**Isaiah 45:22**)

**[Question]** Who does Yehowah God ask to turn to him in true worship, for who alone is God in all the earth?

- 28· And from time long ago none have heard, nor have any given ear, nor has an eye itself seen a **God**, except you, that acts for the one that **keeps** in expectation of him. (**Isaiah 64:4**)

**[Question]** What kind of a God is Yehowah God, and who does he act in behalf of?

- 29· This is what I shall bring back to my heart. That is why I

shall **show** a **waiting attitude**. (**Lamentations 3:21**)

**[Question]** How did Jeremiah show, that he had a waiting attitude toward Yehowah God?

30· Good is Yehowah to the one hoping in him, to the soul that **keeps** seeking for him. (**Lamentations 3:25**)

**[Question]** How does Yehowah God act toward the ones hoping in him?

31· If it is to be, our **God** whom we are serving is able to rescue us. Out of the burning fiery furnace and out of your hand, O king, he **will** rescue us. (**Daniel 3:17**)

**[Question]** How did the three Hebrew men show complete faith in Yehowah God, and his ability to save them?

32· My **God will** reject them, for they have not listened to him, and they **will** become fugitives among the nations. (**Hosea 9:17**)

**[Question]** How did Hosea show, who Yehowah God listens to, and assists, and how he treats others who fail to do so?

33· To you, O Yehowah, I shall call, for fire itself has devoured the pasture grounds of the wilderness, and a very flame has consumed all the trees of the field. (**Joel 1:19**)

**[Question]** How did Joel show a waiting attitude toward his God despite hardships?

34· At my guard post I **will keep** standing, and I **will keep** myself stationed upon the bulwark, and I shall **keep** watch, to see what he **will** speak by me, and what I shall reply at the reproof of me. (**Habakkuk 2:1**)

**[Question]** What did Habakkuk show, that he would patiently keep on the lookout for?

35· For the vision is yet for the appointed time, and it **keeps** panting on to the end, and it **will** not tell a lie. Even if it should delay, **keep** in expectation of it, for it **will** without fail come true. It **will** not be late. (**Habakkuk 2:3**)

**[Question]** What did Habakkuk show, that all men must keep waiting for, for what can they all be sure of?

**36· Yehowah is not slow respecting his promise, as some people consider slowness, but he is patient with **you** because he does not desire any to be destroyed, but desires all to attain to repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)**

**[Question]** Is Yehowah God slow respecting his promises?

**[Question]** Why then, does he perform them in such a wide time frame relative to men's short lives?
