OFFERINGS - COMMUNION - ANYONE MAY PRESENT IT

Leviticus 7:11" Now this is the Law of the communion sacrifice that anyone will present to Yehowah.

[15] - References

- And if his offering is a communion sacrifice, if he is presenting it from the herd, whether a male or a female, a sound one is what he will present before Yehowah. (Leviticus 3:1)
- And the soul who eats the flesh of the communion sacrifice, which is for Yehowah, while his uncleanness is upon him, that soul must be cut off from his people. (Leviticus 7:20)
- And in case a man should present a communion sacrifice to Yehowah in order to pay a vow or as a voluntary offering, it should prove to be a sound one among the herd or the flock, in order to gain approval. No defect at all should prove to be in it. (Leviticus 22:21)
- The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not a sharing in the blood of the Christ? The loaf which we break, is it not a sharing in the body of the Christ? (1 Corinthians 10:16)
- After that he sent young men of the sons of Israel and they offered up burnt offerings and sacrificed bulls as sacrifices, as communion sacrifices to Yehowah. (Exodus 24:5)
- And it must become Aaron's and his sons' by a regulation to time indefinite to be performed by the sons of Israel, because it is a sacred portion, and it will become a sacred portion to be rendered by the sons of Israel. From their communion sacrifices it is their sacred portion for Yehowah. (Exodus 29:28)
- After that he slaughtered the bull and the ram of the communion sacrifice that was for the people. Then Aaron's sons handed him the blood and he sprinkled it round about upon the altar. (Leviticus 9:18)
- In order that the sons of Israel may bring their sacrifices, which they are sacrificing in the open field, and they must bring them to

Yehowah to the entrance of the tent of meeting to the priest, and they must sacrifice these as communion sacrifices to Yehowah. (Leviticus 17:5)

- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five hegoats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of Nahshon the son of Amminadab. (Numbers 7:17)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five hegoats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of Shelumiel the son of Zurishaddai. (Numbers 7:41)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five hegoats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of Abidan the son of Gideoni. (Numbers 7:65)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five hegoats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of Pagiel the son of Ochran. (Numbers 7:77)
- But in case you should render up a male of the herd as a burnt offering or a sacrifice to perform a special vow or communion sacrifices to Yehowah. (Numbers 15:8)
- So all the people went to Gilgal, and there they proceeded to make Saul king before Yehowah in Gilgal. Then they rendered up communion sacrifices there before Yehowah, and there Saul and all the men of Israel continued rejoicing to a great degree. (1 Samuel 11:15)
- When Solomon awoke, why, here it had been a dream. Then he came to Jerusalem and stood before the ark of the covenant of Yehowah and offered up burnt sacrifices and rendered up communion offerings and spread a feast for all his servants. (1 Kings 3:15)
