Numbers 28:16. And in the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, will be Yehowah's Passover.

[14] - References

- And this day must serve as a memorial for You, and You must celebrate it as a festival to Yehowah throughout Your generations. As a statute to time indefinite You should celebrate it. (Exodus 12:14)
- In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, between the two evenings is the Passover to Yehowah. (Leviticus 23:5)
- Let there be an observing of the month of Abib, and you must celebrate the Passover to Yehowah your God, because in the month of Abib Yehowah your God brought you out of Egypt by night.

 (Deuteronomy 16:1)
- In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month, there should occur for you the Passover. As a festival for seven days unfermented cakes are what should be eaten. (Ezekiel 45:21)
- The day of the unfermented cakes now arrived, on which the Passover victim must be sacrificed. (Luke 22:7)
- Clear away the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, according as you are free from ferment. For, indeed, Christ our Passover has been sacrificed. (1 Corinthians 5:7)
- This month will be the start of the months for you. It will be the first of the months of the year for you. (Exodus 12:2)
- And it must continue under safeguard by You until the fourteenth day of this month, and the whole congregation of the assembly of Israel must slaughter it between the two evenings. (Exodus 12:6)
- And in this way you should eat it, with your hips girded, sandals on your feet and your staff in your hand, and you must eat it in haste. It is Yehowah's Passover. (Exodus 12:11)

- Now the sons of Israel should prepare the Passover sacrifice at its appointed time. (Numbers 9:2)
- And you must render up an offering made by fire to Yehowah, a burnt offering or a sacrifice to perform a special vow or voluntarily or during your seasonal festivals, in order to make a restful odor to Yehowah, from the herd or from the flock. (Numbers 15:3)
- The king now commanded all the people, saying; Hold a Passover to Yehowah YOUR God according to what is written in this book of the covenant. (2 Kings 23:21)
- And all the service of Yehowah was prepared on that day to hold the Passover and to offer up the burnt offerings upon the altar of Yehowah, according to the commandment of King Josiah. (2 Chronicles 35:16)
- Now the Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. (John 2:13)
