- And the women that were celebrating kept responding and saying; Saul has struck down his thousands, and David his tens of thousands. (1 Samuel 18:7)
- Listen, You kings, give ear, You high officials; I to Yehowah, yes, I, will sing. I shall make melody to Yehowah, Israel's God. (Judges 5:3)
- As for me, here I am letting the hearts of the Egyptians become obstinate, that they may go in after them and that I may get glory for myself by means of Pharaoh and all his military forces, his war chariots and his cavalrymen. (Exodus 14:17)
