Galatians 1:1~ Paul, an apostle, neither from men nor through a man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him up from the dead.

1. Paul wrote the letter to the Galatians circa 50-52 C.E. The area of Galatia then encompassed the southern Lycaonian cities of Iconium, Lystra, and Derbe as well as the Pisidian city of Antioch. This one letter was not written by a secretary, but Paul wrote it by his own hand, thus the large letters, for his vision was poor.

[Question] When and where, was the letter to the Galatians written?
[Question] Who actually wrote this letter by hand?

2. Paul refers to his appointment neither from men or through another man, but through Jesus Christ, and from God the father, to be an apostle to the Gentile nations.

[Question] Who appointed Paul to be an apostle, and who was he to minister to?

3. Saul, who is also Paul, becoming filled with Holy Spirit, looked at him intently (Acts of Apostles 13:9)

[Question] What was Paul filled with during his ministry?

4. Through whom we received undeserved kindness and an apostleship, in order, that there might be obedience of faith among all the nations, respecting his name. (Romans 1:5)

[Question] What was the purpose of the undeserved kindness given to Paul, to make him an apostle?

5' Paul, a slave of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ according to the faith of God's chosen ones and the accurate knowledge of the truth, which accords with godly devotion (Titus 1:1)

[Question] Who was Paul an apostle of?

6. But the Lord said to him; Be on your way, because this man is a chosen vessel to me, to bear my name to the nations, as well as to kings and the sons of Israel. (Acts of Apostles 9:15)

[Question] What was said about Paul at the start of his extensive ministry?

7. Nevertheless, rise and stand on your feet. For to this end I have made myself visible to you, in order to choose you as an attendant and a witness, both of things you have seen, and things I shall make you see, respecting me. (Acts of Apostles 26:16)

[Question] What was Paul to become a witness to, in his ministerial activity?

8. For neither did I receive it from man, nor was I taught it, except through revelation by Jesus Christ. (Galatians 1:12)

[Question] How did Paul come to understand the Good News?

9. He said, The God of our forefathers has chosen you to come to know his will, and to see the righteous One, and to hear the voice of his mouth. (Acts of Apostles 22:14)

[Question] What was he told at the time of his conversion by Ananias?

10" But God resurrected him by loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to continue to be held fast by it. (Acts of Apostles 2:24)

[Question] What was it not possible for death to do to Christ Jesus?
