Galatians 1:8~ However, even if we or an angel out of heaven were to declare to you as Good News, something beyond what we declared to you as Good News, let him be accursed.¹

1. Paul now shows, that the Good News about the Christ will not change, the message is firm, complete. So that, even if an angel appeared to them out of heaven declaring another Good News, they should not believe it. Let such a one become accursed before God.

[Question] What did Paul then show, about the Good News he presented?

[Question] Who then, would not even be believed, if this Good News was to be changed somehow?

2' If anyone has no affection for the Lord, let him be accursed. O, our Lord, come! (1 Corinthians 16:22)

[Question] What should happen to the one, who has no affection for Jesus Christ?

3. I wish the men who are trying to overturn you, would even get themselves emasculated. (Galatians 5:12)

[Question] What did Paul wish for those who were thus trying to overturn the Galatians?

4' You must not accede to his wish, or listen to him, nor should your eye feel sorry for him, nor must you feel compassion, nor cover him protectively. (Deuteronomy 13:8)

[Question] How were the Israelites told to treat an apostate?

5. At this he said to him; I too am a prophet like you, and an angel himself spoke to me by the word of Yehowah, saying; Have him come back with you to your house, that he may eat bread and drink water. He deceived him. (1 Kings 13:18)

[Question] What did false prophets sometimes do?

6. A stranger they will by no means follow, but will flee from

him, because they do not know the voice of strangers. (John 10:5)

[Question] What illustration did Jesus give showing, that those who follow his word, do so because they know him?

7. For, as it is, if someone comes and preaches a Jesus other than the one we preached, or you receive a spirit other than what you received, or Good News other than what you accepted, you easily put up with him. (2 Corinthians 11:4)

[Question] What willingness to accept change did the Corinthians go overboard with?

8 And no wonder, for Satan himself keeps transforming himself into an angel of light. (2 Corinthians 11:14)

[Question] What does Satan the Devil keep transforming himself into?

9. I am bearing witness to everyone that hears the words of the prophecy of this scroll. If anyone makes an addition to these things, God will add to him the plagues, that are written in this scroll. (Revelation 22:18)

[Question] What will happen to anyone changing the truth of God?
