Galatians 2:11~ However, when Cephas came to Antioch, I resisted him face to face, because he stood condemned.

1. However when Cephas came to Antioch, Paul's home congregation, Paul resisted him face to face. In Paul's eyes Peter stood condemned, for he was not behaving properly according to that Good News, which they both preached.

[Question] How did Paul act toward Peter, when Peter visited Antioch, Paul's home congregation?

2. He led him to Jesus. When Jesus looked upon him he said; You are Simon the son of John, you will be called Cephas, which is translated Peter. (John 1:42)

[Question] What name change had Jesus instituted for Peter?

3. And, after he found him, he brought him to Antioch. It thus came about, that for a whole year, they gathered together with them in the congregation, and taught quite a crowd, and it was first in Antioch, that the disciples were by divine providence called Christians. (Acts of Apostles 11:26)

[Question] Where were disciples of Christ, first, by divine providence, called Christians?

4. However, Paul and Barnabas continued spending time in Antioch teaching and declaring, with many others also, the Good News of the word of Yehowah. (Acts of Apostles 15:35)

[Question] What work did Paul engage in, there in Antioch extensively?

5' You must not hate your brother in your heart. You should by all means reprove your associate, that you may not bear sin along with him. (Leviticus 19:17)

[Question] What should we do, if we see a brother sinning?

6' Who will tell him of his way to his very face? And for what he himself has done, who will reward him? (Job 21:31)

[Question] What did Job see was necessary to help another?

7. Look! In this you have not been in the right, I answer you, for God is much more than mortal man. (Job 33:12)

[Question] What did Job say to those who presented invalid arguments?

8. Should the righteous one strike me, it would be a loving-kindness, and should he reprove me, it would be oil upon the head, which my head would not want to refuse. For still there would be even my prayer during their calamities. (Psalms 141:5)

[Question] How did the Psalmist feel, about the one who would reprove him?

9. He that is reproving a man, will afterward find more favor, than he will that is flattering with his tongue. (Proverbs 28:23)

[Question] What will the one reproving a man find afterwards through it?
