

Galatians 2:2~ But I went up as a result of a revelation. And I laid before them the Good News which I am preaching¹ among the nations, privately, however, before those who were outstanding men, for fear that somehow, I was running or had run in vain.

Footnote: Or, I am heralding Greek, *ke·rys'so*; Latin, *prae'di-co* Compare (Daniel 5:29) Footnote Heralded

- 1· Then is was, that Paul showed them the Good News, that he was preaching, which he had received through a revelation directly from Christ. He did this privately, before the older ones gathered there, so as not to cause any division among the disciples, if there should be any failure in the things he was preaching about the Christ among the nations.

[Question] When Paul returned fourteen years later, what message did he present to the apostles, and for what purpose?

- 2· But at this time, brothers, if I should come speaking to you in tongues, what **good** would I do, you unless I spoke to you either with a **revelation**, or with knowledge, or with a prophecy, or with a teaching? (**1 Corinthians 14:6**)

[Question] What did Paul want to present to others through the spirit?

- 3· At that the entire multitude became silent, and they began to listen to Barnabas and Paul, relate the many signs and portents, that God did through them, **among** the **nations**. (**Acts of Apostles 15:12**)

[Question] What things did Paul and Barnabus then relate, to those in Jerusalem about their ministry, and God's support of it?

- 4· You were **running** well. Who hindered you from keeping on obeying the truth? (**Galatians 5:7**)

[Question] What question did Paul ask of the Galatians, concerning their course?

- 5· Keeping a tight grip on the word of life, that I may have cause for exultation in Christ's day, that I did not **run** in **vain**, or work hard in **vain**. (**Philippians 2:16**)

[Question] How did Paul try to keep a tight grip on the truth, and for what purpose?

- 6· That is why, indeed, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to know of your faithfulness, as perhaps in some way the Tempter might have tempted you, and our labor might have turned out to be in **vain**. (**1 Thessalonians 3:5**)

[Question] Why did Paul write to the congregation repeatedly, for what was his concern over them?

- 7· Do you not know that the runners in a race all **run**, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may attain it. (**1 Corinthians 9:24**)

[Question] How did Paul encourage anointed Christians, to run in the race for life?

- 8· For neither did I receive it from man, nor was I taught it, except through **revelation** by Jesus Christ. (**Galatians 1:12**)

[Question] How did Paul himself come to know the Good News of God?

- 9· I **fear** for you, that **somehow** I have toiled to no purpose respecting you. (**Galatians 4:11**)

[Question] What fear did Paul express to the Galatians?
