Galatians 3:20~ Now there is no mediator where only one person is concerned, but God¹ is only one.

1. Now Paul points to the fact, that if only one person is involved, then no mediator is needed. What he is saying here is that Jesus Christ is our mediator, because we are his spiritual offspring or seed, and since the seed is spoken of as being singular, pointing primarily to the most prominent one among this seed, their head, and since they all become one spiritual body through marriage under the New Covenant, that a mediator is needed for the rest of the seed of promise who comprise this one spiritual body. But Yehowah God is one Yehowah, and all who are at unity with him, will be one body also.

[Question] Who is the mediator for anointed Christians, and why so?

[Question] What though, is Yehowah God, and all who are in union with him?

2. Listen, O Israel, Yehowah our God is one Yehowah. (Deuteronomy 6:4)

3. And Yehowah must become king over all the earth. In that day Yehowah will prove to be one, and his name one. (Zechariah 14:9)

[Question] Who will become king over all the earth?

4 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, a man, Christ Jesus. (1 Timothy 2:5)
