

Galatians 6:9~ So let us not give up in doing what is fine, for in due season we shall reap if we do not tire out.

- 1· Therefore the course of Christians is clearly set forth. Let us **not give up in doing what is fine**, for if we stay firmly fixed upon this fine course, we can by no means fail. Just like the farmer Paul mentioned earlier who planted seeds, we will reap a crop of righteousness and everlasting life, if we do all the necessary things to guard our fields, and work the crop, until the harvest time comes. This is God's good promise, the worker deserves his wages.

[Question] What course then, is firmly set before all anointed Christians?

[Question] How does Paul now illustrate, how we can expect to be rewarded?

- 2· For your part, brothers, do not **give up in doing** right. (2 **Thessalonians 3:13**)

[Question] What should we never give up in doing, and why?

- 3· For we actually become partakers of the Christ, only if we make fast our hold on the confidence we had at the beginning, **firm to the end**. (**Hebrews 3:14**)

[Question] How do we actually become partakers of the Christ, only after what?

- 4· Indeed, consider closely the one who has endured such contrary talk by sinners against their own interests, that you may not get tired and **give out** in your souls. (**Hebrews 12:3**)

[Question] Why then, should we consider the course of Jesus Christ closely?

- 5· Do not be afraid of the things you are about to suffer. Look! The Devil will keep on throwing some of you into prison that you may be fully put to the test, and that you may have tribulation ten days. Prove yourself faithful even to death, and I will **give** you the crown of life. (**Revelation 2:10**)

[Question] How should we view suffering, if it comes to us?

[Question] What is certain to happen, if we prove ourselves faithful even unto death through suffering?

- 6· **You are also showing endurance, and you have borne up for my name's sake and have not grown weary. ([Revelation 2:3](#))**

[Question] What did Jesus Christ commend the anointed congregation for in Revelation?

- 7· **Happy are those observing justice, [doing](#) righteousness all the time. ([Psalms 106:3](#))**

[Question] Who are to be declared happy?

- 8· **For you have need of endurance, in order, that, after you have done the will of God, you may receive the fulfillment of the promise. ([Hebrews 10:36](#))**

[Question] Why do anointed Christians have need of endurance?
