to God through the torture stake, because he had killed off the enmity by means of himself.¹

Footnote: Or, it

- He now has again reconciled by means of that one's fleshly body through his death, in order to present you holy and unblemished and open to no accusation before him. (Colossians 1:22)
- There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor freeman, there is neither male nor female. For you are all one person in union with Christ Jesus. (Galatians 3:28)
- One body there is, and one spirit, even as you were called in the one hope to which you were called. (Ephesians 4:4)
- As we look intently at the Chief Agent and Perfecter of our faith, Jesus. For the joy that was set before him he endured a torture stake, despising shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. (Hebrews 12:2)
- And he said to them; You well know how unlawful it is for a Jew to join himself to or approach a man of another race, and yet God has shown me I should call no man defiled or unclean. (Acts of Apostles 10:28)
- Out of YOUR dwelling places YOU should bring two loaves as a wave offering. Of two tenths of an ephah of fine flour they should prove to be. They should be baked leavened, as first ripe fruits to Yehowah. (Leviticus 23:17)
- But all things are from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of the reconciliation. (2 Corinthians 5:18)
- Namely, that people of the nations should be joint heirs and fellow members of the body and partakers with us of the promise in union with Christ Jesus through the Good News. (Ephesians 3:6)
