[8] - References:

- Perhaps, when I come again, my God might humiliate me **among YOU**, and I might mourn over many of those who formerly sinned but have not repented over their **uncleanness** and **fornication** and loose conduct that they have practiced. (**2 Corinthians 12:21**)
- But now I am writing **YOU** to quit mixing in company with anyone called a brother that is a fornicator or a greedy person or an idolater or a reviler or a drunkard or an extortioner, not **even** eating with such a man. (**1 Corinthians 5:11**)
- Deaden, therefore, **YOUR** body members that are upon the earth as respects **fornication**, **uncleanness**, sexual appetite, hurtful desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. (**Colossians 3:5**)
- For this is what God wills, the sanctifying of **YOU**, that **YOU** abstain from **fornication**. (**1 Thessalonians 4:3**)
- Later Ham the father of Canaan saw his father's nakedness and went telling it to his two brothers outside. (**Genesis 9:22**)
- What, then, shall we say? Is the Law sin? Never may that become so! Really I would not have come to know sin if it had not been for the Law, and, for example, I would not have known covetousness if the Law had not said; You must not covet. (**Romans 7:7**)
- Actually **fornication** is reported **among YOU**, and such **fornication** as is not **even among** the nations, that a wife a certain man has of his father. (**1 Corinthians 5:1**)
- Now the works of the flesh are manifest, and they are **fornication**, **uncleanness**, loose conduct. (**Galatians 5:19**)
