- You fathers, do not be exasperating your children, so that they do not become downhearted. (Colossians 3:21)
- Train up a boy according to the way for him, even when he grows old he will not turn aside from it. (Proverbs 22:6)
- The discipline of Yehowah, O my son, do not reject, and do not abhor his reproof. (Proverbs 3:11)
- The one holding back his rod is hating his son, but the one loving him is he that does look for him with discipline. (Proverbs 13:24)
- Chastise your son while there exists hope, and to the putting of him to death do not lift up your soulful desire. (Proverbs 19:18)
