Figure 1:5" You slaves, be obedient to those who are your masters in a fleshly sense, with fear and trembling in the sincerity of your hearts, as to the Christ.

- Let as many as are slaves under a yoke keep on considering their owners worthy of full honor, that the name of God and the teaching may never be spoken of injuriously. (1 Timothy 6:1)
- Let house servants be in subjection to their owners with all due fear, not only to the good and reasonable, but also to those hard to please. (1 Peter 2:18)
- Consequently, my beloved ones, in the way that YOU have always obeyed, not during my presence only, but now much more readily during my absence, keep working out YOUR own salvation with fear and trembling. (Philippians 2:12)
- And Yehowah's angel went on to say to her; Return to your mistress and humble yourself under her hand. (Genesis 16:9)
- Then something to eat was set before him, but he said; I shall not eat until I have spoken about my matters. Hence he said; Speak! (Genesis 24:33)
- You slaves, be obedient in everything to those who are your masters in a fleshly sense, not with acts of eye-service, as men pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, with fear of Yehowah. (Colossians 3:22)
- Let slaves be in subjection to their owners in all things, and please them well, not talking back. (Titus 2:9)
- For the Lord's sake subject yourselves to every human creation;
 whether to a king as being superior (1 Peter 2:13)
