## **WICKED - CRITICIZE RIGHTEOUS ONES**

- Men ··· Unrighteous ··· Criticize Righteous Ones The presiding officer of the synagogue told Jesus, there are six days on which work must be done, but there should be no curing of people on the Sabbath (Luke 13:14) [11] References
- But in response the presiding officer of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus did the cure on the Sabbath, began to say to the crowd; There are six days on which work ought to be done, on them, therefore, come and be cured, and not on the Sabbath day.

[11] - References

- You are to render service and you must do all your work six days. (Exodus 20:9)
- Six days you are to do your work, but on the seventh day you are to desist, in order, that your bull and your ass may rest and the son of your slave girl and the alien resident may refresh themselves. (Exodus 23:12)
- Six days may work be done, but on the seventh day it will become something holy to you, a Sabbath of complete rest to Yehowah. Anybody doing work on it will be put to death. (Exodus 35:2)
- But the seventh day is a Sabbath to Yehowah your God. You must not do any work, you nor your son nor your daughter nor your slave man nor your slave girl nor your bull nor your ass nor any domestic animal of yours nor your alien resident who is inside your gates, in order, that your slave man and your slave girl may rest the same as you. (Deuteronomy 5:14)
- And, look! A man with a withered hand! So they asked him; Is it Lawful to cure on the Sabbath? That they might get an accusation against him. (Matthew 12:10)
- So they were watching him closely to see whether he would cure the man on the Sabbath, in order, that they might accuse him. (Mark 3:2)
- So on this account the Jews went persecuting Jesus, because he was doing these things during Sabbath. (John 5:16)

- Six days you are to labor, but on the seventh day you will keep Sabbath. In plowing time and in harvest you will keep Sabbath. (Exodus 34:21)
- For the reason that with flank and with shoulder you kept pushing and with your horns you kept shoving all the sickened ones until you had scattered them to the outside. (Ezekiel 34:21)
- In the course of another Sabbath he entered into the synagogue and began teaching. And there was a man present whose right hand was withered. (Luke 6:6)
- Incidentally it was Sabbath on the day that Jesus made the clay and opened his eyes. (John 9:14)
