## WICKED - HARD PRESSED AND HUNGRY

~ Men ··· Unrighteous ··· Hard Pressed And Hungry - They will pass through the land hard pressed and hungry and thus will feel indignant and thus call down evil upon his God and king (Isaiah 8:21) [12] - References

Isaiah 8:21... And each one will certainly pass through the land hard pressed and hungry, and it must occur that because he is hungry and has made himself feel indignant, he will actually call down evil upon his king and upon his God and will certainly peer upward.

[12] - References

- And you will have to serve your enemies whom Yehowah will send against you with hunger and thirst and nakedness and the want of everything, and he will certainly put an iron yoke upon your neck until he has annihilated you. (Deuteronomy 28:48)
- On the ninth day of the fourth month the famine was severe in the city, and there proved to be no bread for the people of the land. (2 Kings 25:3)
- In the fourth month, on the ninth day of the month, the famine also got to be severe in the city and there proved to be no bread for the people of the land. (Jeremiah 52:6)
- The tongue of the suckling has cleaved to its palate because of thirst. Children themselves have asked for bread. There is no one dealing it out to them. (Lamentations 4:4)
- You must not call down evil upon God nor curse a chieftain among your people. (Exodus 22:28)
- It is the foolishness of an earthling man that distorts his way, and so his heart becomes enraged against Yehowah himself. (Proverbs 19:3)
- And the son of the Israelite woman began to abuse the Name and to call down evil upon it. So they brought him to Moses. Incidentally, his mother's name was Shelomith, the daughter of Dibri of the tribe of Dan. (Leviticus 24:11)

- At length the king of Israel said; How unfortunate that Yehowah has called these three kings to give them into the hand of Moab! (2 Kings 3:10)
- While he was yet speaking with them, here was the messenger coming down to him, and the king proceeded to say; Here this is the calamity from Yehowah. Why should I wait any longer for Yehowah? (2 Kings 6:33)
- But, for a change, thrust out your hand, please, and touch everything he has and see whether he will not curse you to your very face. (Job 1:11)
- Even in your bedroom do not call down evil upon the king himself, and in the interior rooms where you lie down do not call down evil upon anyone rich, for a flying creature of the heavens will convey the sound and something owning wings will tell the matter. (Ecclesiastes 10:20)
- With the curse you are cursing me, and me you are robbing, the nation in its entirety. (Malachi 3:9)
