WICKED - PRODUCE NO GOOD FRUITAGE

- ~ Men ··· Unrighteous ··· Produce No Good Fruitage I am removing its protective hedge and I will burn it down and it must become a place of trampling because it failed to produce good fruitage (Isaiah 5:5) [19] References
- And now, please, may I make known to you men what I am doing to my vineyard; There will be a removing of its hedge, and it must be destined for burning down. There must be a breaking down of its stone wall, and it must be destined for a place of trampling.

- But as for the courtyard that is outside the temple sanctuary, cast it clear out and do not measure it, because it has been given to the nations, and they will trample the holy city underfoot for forty-two months. (Revelation 11:2)
- And they will fall by the edge of the sword and be led captive into all the nations, and Jerusalem will be trampled on by the nations, until the appointed times of the nations are fulfilled. (Luke 21:24)
- Have not you yourself put up a hedge about him and about his house and about everything that he has all around? The work of his hands you have blessed, and his livestock itself has spread abroad in the earth. (Job 1:10)
- And I shall indeed give YOUR cities to the sword and lay YOUR sanctuaries desolate, and I shall not smell YOUR restful odors. (Leviticus 26:31)
- And it must occur that just as Yehowah exulted over you to do you good and to multiply you, so Yehowah will exult over you to destroy you and to annihilate you, and you will simply be torn away from off the soil to which you are going to take possession of it. (Deuteronomy 28:63)
- Then I said to the king; Let the king himself live to time indefinite! Why should not my face become gloomy when the city, the house of the burial places of my forefathers, is devastated, and its very gates have been eaten up with fire? (Nehemiah 2:3)

- O God, the nations have come into your inheritance, they have defiled your holy temple, they have laid Jerusalem in a heap of ruins. (Psalms 79:1)
- Yehowah has cast off his altar. He has spurned his sanctuary. Into the hand of the enemy he has surrendered the walls of her dwelling towers. In the house of Yehowah they have let out their own voice, as in the day of a festival. (Lamentations 2:7)
- The foot will trample it down, the feet of the afflicted one, the steps of the lowly ones. (Isaiah 26:6)
- All my powerful ones Yehowah has tossed aside from the midst of me. He has called against me a meeting, in order to break my young men to pieces. Yehowah has trodden the very winepress belonging to the virgin daughter of Judah. (Lamentations 1:15)
- For we are servants, and in our servitude our God has not left us, but he extends toward us loving-kindness before the kings of Persia, to give us a reviving so as to raise up the house of our God and to restore its desolated places and to give us a stone wall in Judah and in Jerusalem. (Ezra 9:9)
- Accordingly they said to me; Those left over, who have been left over from the captivity, there in the jurisdictional district, are in a very bad plight and in reproach, and the wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its very gates have been burned with fire. (Nehemiah 1:3)
- Why have you broken down its stone walls, and why have all those passing by on the road plucked at it? (Psalms 80:12)
- For it is the day of confusion and of downtreading and of confounding that the Sovereign Lord, Yehowah of armies, has in the valley of the vision. There is the demolisher of the wall, and the cry to the mountain. (Isaiah 22:5)
- Look! Yehowah is emptying the land and laying it waste, and he has twisted the face of it and scattered its inhabitants. (Isaiah 24:1)
- This is what you should say to him; This is what Yehowah has said; Look! What I have built up I am tearing down, and what I have planted I am uprooting, even all the land itself. (Jeremiah 45:4)
- You men will certainly not go up into the gaps, neither will you build up a stone wall in behalf of the house of Israel, in order to stand in the battle in the day of Yehowah. (Ezekiel 13:5)

- But she was finally uprooted in fury. To the earth she was thrown, and there was an east wind that dried up her fruit. Her strong rod was torn off and became dry. Fire itself devoured it. (Ezekiel 19:12)
- And I will lay desolate her vine and her fig tree, of which she has said; They are a gift to me, which my passionate lovers have given to me, and I will set them as a forest, and the wild beast of the field will certainly devour them. (Hosea 2:12)
