Psalms 37:32. The wicked one is keeping on the watch for the righteous and is seeking to put him to death.

[24] - References

- For I heard the bad report of many. There was fright all around. Tell out, that we may tell out about him. Every mortal man bidding me Peace! they are watching for my limping; Perhaps he will be fooled, so that we may prevail against him and take our revenge upon him. (Jeremiah 20:10)
- The scribes and the Pharisees were now watching him closely to see whether he would cure on the Sabbath, in order to find some way to accuse him. (Luke 6:7)
- He sits in an ambush of settlements, from concealed places he will kill someone innocent. His eyes are on the lookout for someone unfortunate. (Psalms 10:8)
- Furthermore, he went teaching daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the principal ones of the people were seeking to destroy him. (Luke 19:47)
- However, their plot against him became known to Saul. But they were closely watching also the gates both day and night in order to do away with him. (Acts of Apostles 9:24)
- And Saul proceeded to hurl the spear and say; I will pin David even to the wall! But David turned aside from before him, twice. (1 Samuel 18:11)
- And Saul proceeded to take three thousand chosen men out of all Israel and to go looking for David and his men upon the bare rocks of the mountain goats. (1 Samuel 24:2)

- Sanballat and Geshem immediately sent to me, saying; Do come, and let us meet together by appointment in the villages of the valley plain of Ono. But they were scheming to do me harm. (Nehemiah 6:2)
- They attack, they conceal themselves, they, for their part, keep observing my very steps, while they have waited for my soul. (Psalms 56:6)
- For, look! They have lain in wait for my soul, strong ones make an attack upon me, for no revolt on my part, nor any sin on my part, O Yehowah. (Psalms 59:3)
- For the reason that he did not remember to exercise loving-kindness, but he kept pursuing the afflicted and poor man and the one dejected at heart, to put him to death. (Psalms 109:16)
- For me the wicked have waited, to destroy me. To your reminders I keep showing myself attentive. (Psalms 119:95)
- Had it not been that Yehowah proved to be for us when men rose up against us. (Psalms 124:2)
- With a complete hatred I do hate them. They have become to me real enemies. (Psalms 139:22)
- Do not, as a wicked one, lie in wait for the abiding place of the righteous one, do not despoil his resting-place. (Proverbs 24:15)
- And I was like a male lamb, an intimate one, that is brought to slaughter, and I did not know that it was against me that they thought out schemes; Let us bring to ruin the tree with its food, and let us cut him off from the land of the living ones, that his very name may no more be remembered. (Jeremiah 11:19)
- But you yourself, O Yehowah, well know all their counsel against me for my death. Do not cover over their error, and do not wipe out that sin of theirs from before you, but let them become those who are made to stumble before you. In the time of your anger take action against them. (Jeremiah 18:23)
- So it came about that when Jeremiah had completed speaking all that Yehowah had commanded him to speak to all the people, then the priests and the prophets and all the people laid hold of him, saying; You will positively die. (Jeremiah 26:8)
- At that time these able-bodied men themselves crowded in and found Daniel petitioning and imploring favor before his God. (Daniel 6:11)

- But Herodias was nursing a grudge against him and was wanting to kill him, but could not. (Mark 6:19)
- Meantime the chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for testimony against Jesus to put him to death, but they were not finding any. (Mark 14:55)
- Lying in wait for him, to catch something out of his mouth. (Luke 11:54)
- And on an occasion when he went into the house of a certain one of the rulers of the Pharisees on the Sabbath to eat a meal, they were closely watching him. (Luke 14:1)
- Asking for themselves as a favor against the man that he would send for him to come to Jerusalem, as they were laying an ambush to do away with him along the road. (Acts of Apostles 25:3)
