Proverbs 20:1. Wine is a ridiculer, intoxicating liquor is boisterous, and everyone going astray by it is not wise.

- And he began drinking of the wine and became intoxicated, and so he uncovered himself in the midst of his tent. (Genesis 9:21)
- They reel and move unsteadily like a drunken man, and even all their wisdom proves confused. (Psalms 107:27)
- Do not look at wine when it exhibits a red color, when it gives off its sparkle in the cup, when it goes with a slickness. (Proverbs 23:31)
- Yehowah himself has mingled in the midst of her the spirit of disconcertedness, and they have caused Egypt to wander about in all its work, just as someone drunk is made to wander about in his vomit. (Isaiah 19:14)
- And these also, because of wine they have gone astray and because of intoxicating liquor they have wandered about. Priest and prophet, they have gone astray because of intoxicating liquor, they have become confused as a result of the wine, they have wandered about as a result of the intoxicating liquor, they have gone astray in their seeing, they have reeled as to decision. (Isaiah 28:7)
- Later Abigail came in to Nabal, and there he was having a feast in his house like the feast of the king, and Nabal's heart was feeling good within him, and he was as drunk as could be, and she did not tell him a thing, small or great, until the morning light. (1 Samuel 25:36)
- At its end it bites just like a serpent, and it secretes poison just like a viper. (Proverbs 23:32)
- Nor thieves, nor greedy persons, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit God's kingdom. (1 Corinthians 6:10)
- Envies, drunken bouts, revelries, and things like these. As to these things I am forewarning you, the same way as I did forewarn you,

that those who practice such things will not inherit God's kingdom. (Galatians 5:21)

- Also, do not be getting drunk with wine, in which there is debauchery, but keep getting filled with spirit. (Ephesians 5:18)
- And they must say to the older men of his city; This son of ours is stubborn and rebellious, he is not listening to our voice, being a glutton and a drunkard. (Deuteronomy 21:20)
- Further, David called him that he might eat before him and drink. So he got him drunk. Nevertheless, he went out in the evening to lie down on his bed with the servants of his lord, and to his own house he did not go down. (2 Samuel 11:13)
- And his servant Zimri the chief of half the chariots began to conspire against him, while he was in Tirzah drinking himself drunk at the house of Arza, who was over the household in Tirzah. (1 Kings 16:9)
- Do not come to be among heavy drinkers of wine, among those who are gluttonous eaters of flesh. (Proverbs 23:20)
- Who has woe? Who has uneasiness? Who has contentions? Who has concern? Who has wounds for no reason? Who has duliness of eyes? (Proverbs 23:29)
- Woe to those who are getting up early in the morning that they may seek just intoxicating liquor, who are lingering till late in the evening darkness so that wine itself inflames them! (Isaiah 5:11)
- Belshazzar, under the influence of the wine, said to bring in the vessels of gold and of silver that Nebuchadnezzar his father had taken away from the temple that was in Jerusalem, that from them the king and his grandees, his concubines and his secondary wives might drink. (Daniel 5:2)
- Fornication and wine and sweet wine are what take away good motive. (Hosea 4:11)
- On the day of our king, princes have sickened themselves, there is a rage because of wine. He has drawn his hand along with deriders. (Hosea 7:5)
- And, indeed, because the wine is dealing treacherously, an ablebodied man is self-assuming, and he will not reach his goal, he who has made his soul spacious just like Sheol, and who is like death and

cannot be satisfied. And he keeps gathering to himself all the nations and collecting together to himself all the peoples. (Habakkuk 2:5)
