- My son, to my wisdom O do pay attention. To my discernment incline your ears. (Proverbs 5:1)
- He that is walking with wise persons will become wise, but he that is having dealings with the stupid ones will fare badly. (Proverbs 13:20)
- Incline YOUR ear and come to me. Listen, and YOUR soul will keep alive, and I shall readily conclude with YOU people an indefinitely lasting covenant respecting the loving-kindnesses to David that are faithful. (Isaiah 55:3)
- While he was yet speaking, look! A bright cloud overshadowed them, and, look! A voice out of the cloud, saying; This is my Son, the beloved, whom I have approved, listen to him. (Matthew 17:5)
- The understanding heart is one that searches for knowledge, but the mouth of stupid people is one that aspires to foolishness. (Proverbs 15:14)
- Do bring your heart to discipline and your ear to the sayings of knowledge. (Proverbs 23:12)
