Men ··· Righteous ··· Wisdom And Justice - The mouth of the righteous one utters wisdom and his tongue speaks justly (Psalms 37:30) [11] - References

Psalms 37:30... The mouth of the righteous is the one that utters wisdom in an undertone, and his is the tongue that speaks justly.

[11] - References

- This book of the Law should not depart from your mouth, and you must in an undertone read in it day and night, in order, that you may take care to do according to all that is written in it, for then you will make your way successful and then you will act wisely. (Joshua 1:8)
- But his delight is in the Law of Yehowah, and in his Law he reads in an undertone day and night. (Psalms 1:2)
- The good man out of his good treasure sends out good things, whereas the wicked man out of his wicked treasure sends out wicked things. (Matthew 12:35)
- Let a rotten saying not proceed out of YOUR mouth, but whatever saying is good for building up as the need may be, that it may impart what is favorable to the hearers. (Ephesians 4:29)
- Let Your utterance be always with graciousness, seasoned with salt, so as to know how You ought to give an answer to each one. (Colossians 4:6)
- The mouth of the righteous one is a source of life, but as regards the mouth of the wicked ones, it covers up violence. (Proverbs 10:11)
- The mouth of the righteous one, it bears the fruit of wisdom, but the tongue of perverseness will be cut off. (Proverbs 10:31)
- The lips of the wise ones keep scattering knowledge about, but the heart of the stupid ones is not like that. (Proverbs 15:7)
- The heart of the wise one causes his mouth to show insight, and to his lips it adds persuasiveness. (Proverbs 16:23)
