- The proverbs of Solomon the **son** of David, the king of Israel. (**Proverbs 1:1**)
- A **son** is wise where there is a father's discipline, but the ridiculer is one that has not heard rebuke. (**Proverbs 13:1**)
- The **father** of a righteous one will without fail be joyful, the one becoming **father** to a wise one will also **rejoice** in him. (**Proverbs 23:24**)
- Be wise, my **son**, and make my heart **rejoice**, that I may make a reply to him that is taunting me. (**Proverbs 27:11**)
- A man that is loving wisdom **makes** his **father rejoice**, but he that is having companionship with prostitutes destroys valuable things. (**Proverbs 29:3**)
- A wise **son** is the one that **makes a father rejoice**, but a **stupid** man is despising his **mother**. (**Proverbs 15:20**)
- Anyone becoming **father** to a **stupid** child, it is a **grief** to him, and the **father** of a senseless child does not **rejoice**. (**Proverbs 17:21**)
- A **stupid son** is a vexation to his **father** and a bitterness to her that gave him birth. (**Proverbs 17:25**)
- Then the king became disturbed and went up to the roof chamber over the gateway and gave way to weeping, and this is what he said as he walked; My **son** Absalom, my **son**, my **son** Absalom! O that I might have died, I myself, instead of you, Absalom my **son**, my son! (**2 Samuel 18:33**)
- And it came about that as soon as Hiram heard the words of Solomon, he began to **rejoice** greatly, and he went on to say; Blessed

is Yehowah today in that he has given David a wise **son** over this numerous people! (**1 Kings 5:7**)

- A **stupid son** means adversities to his **father**, and the contentions of a wife are as a leaking roof that drives one away. (**Proverbs 19:13**)

- My **son**, if your heart has become wise, my heart will **rejoice**, even mine. (**Proverbs 23:15**)

- These also are the proverbs of Solomon that the men of Hezekiah the king of Judah transcribed. (**Proverbs 25:1**)

- The rod and reproof are what give wisdom, but a boy let on the loose will be causing his **mother** shame. (**Proverbs 29:15**)
