WITNESSES - PAUL - HE RAISED UP DAVID AS KING

Witness ··· Paul ··· He Raised Up David - As king about whom he said; I have found David a man agreeable to my heart who will do all the things I desire (Acts of Apostles 13:22) [17] - References

Acts of Apostles 13:22. And after removing him, he raised up for them David as king, respecting whom he bore witness and said; I have found David the son of Jesse, a man agreeable to my heart, who will do all the things I desire.

[17] - References

- I proceeded to give you a king in my anger, and I shall take him away in my fury. (Hosea 13:11)
- · Accordingly he sent and had him come. Now he was ruddy, a young man with beautiful eyes and handsome in appearance. Then Yehowah said; Get up, anoint him, for this is he! (1 Samuel 16:12)
- Then the men of Judah came and anointed David there as king over the house of Judah. And they came telling David, saying; The men of Jabesh-gilead were the ones that buried Saul. (2 Samuel 2:4)
- I have found David my servant, with my holy oil I have anointed him. (Psalms 89:20)
- Eventually Yehowah said to Samuel; For how long will you be mourning for Saul, while I, on the other hand, have rejected him from ruling as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go. I shall send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, because I have provided among his sons a king for myself. (1 Samuel 16:1)
- They, however, went on from Perga and came to Antioch in Pisidia and, going into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, they took a seat. (Acts of Apostles 13:14)
- The One saying of Cyrus: He is my shepherd, and all that I delight in he will completely carry out. Even in my saying of Jerusalem: She will be rebuilt. And of the temple: You will have your foundation laid. (Isaiah 44:28)

- And now your kingdom will not last. Yehowah will certainly find for himself a man agreeable to his heart, and Yehowah will commission him as a leader over his people, because you did not keep what Yehowah commanded you. (1 Samuel 13:14)
- For rebelliousness is the same as the sin of divination, and pushing ahead presumptuously the same as using uncanny power and teraphim. Since you have rejected the word of Yehowah, he accordingly rejects you from being king. (1 Samuel 15:23)
- At this Samuel said to him; Yehowah has ripped away the royal rule of Israel from off you today, and he will certainly give it to a fellowman of yours who is better than you. (1 Samuel 15:28)
- Saul now said to him; Whose son are you, boy? To which David said; The son of your servant Jesse the Bethlehemite. (1 Samuel 17:58)
- Accordingly Abner sent messengers to David on the spot, saying; To whom does the land belong? Adding; Do conclude your covenant with me, and, look! My hand will be with you to turn to your side the whole of Israel. (2 Samuel 3:12)
- And now act, for Yehowah himself said to David; By the hand of David my servant I shall save my people Israel from the hand of the Philistines and from the hand of all their enemies. (2 Samuel 3:18)
- So all the older men of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David concluded a covenant with them in Hebron before Yehowah, after which they anointed David as king over Israel. (2 Samuel 5:3)
- At this David said to Michal; It was before Yehowah, who chose me rather than your father and all his household to put me in command as leader over Yehowah's people Israel, and I will celebrate before Yehowah. (2 Samuel 6:21)
- And I went on to rip the kingdom away from the house of David and give it to you, and you have not become like my servant David, who kept my commandments and who walked after me with all his heart by doing only what was right in my eyes. (1 Kings 14:8)
- The prayers of David, the son of Jesse, have come to their end. (Psalms 72:20)
