Revelation 18:21. And a strong angel lifted up a stone like a great millstone and hurled it into the sea, saying; Thus with a swift pitch will Babylon the great city be hurled down, and she will never be found again.

- Who really is the faithful and discreet slave whom his master appointed over his domestics, to give them their food at the proper time? (Matthew 24:45)
- Happy is that slave if his master on arriving finds him doing so.
 (Matthew 24:46)
- Truly I say to YOU, he will appoint him over all his belongings. (Matthew 24:47)
- But if ever that evil slave should say in his heart; My master is delaying. (Matthew 24:48)
- And should start to beat his fellow slaves and should eat and drink with the confirmed drunkards. (Matthew 24:49)
- The master of that slave will come on a day that he does not expect and in an hour that he does not know. (Matthew 24:50)
- And will punish him with the greatest severity and will assign him his part with the hypocrites. There is where his weeping and the gnashing of his teeth will be. (Matthew 24:51)
- So now let Pharaoh look for a man discreet and wise and set him over the land of Egypt. (Genesis 41:33)
- Let Pharaoh act and appoint overseers over the land, and he must take up one fifth of the land of Egypt during the seven years of plenty. (Genesis 41:34)
- And let them collect all the foodstuffs of these coming good years, and let them pile up grain under Pharaoh's hand as foodstuffs in the cities, and they must safeguard it. (Genesis 41:35)
- And the foodstuffs must serve as a supply for the land for the seven famine years, which will develop in the land of Egypt, in

- order that the land may not be cut off by the famine. (Genesis 41:36)
- Well, the thing proved to be good in the eyes of Pharaoh and of all his servants. (Genesis 41:37)
- So Pharaoh said to his servants; Can another man be found like this one in whom the spirit of God is? (Genesis 41:38)
- After that Pharaoh said to Joseph; Since God has caused you to know all this, there is no one as discreet and wise as you are. (Genesis 41:39)
- You will personally be over my house, and all my people will obey you implicitly. Only as to the throne shall I be greater than you. (Genesis 41:40)
- And Pharaoh added to Joseph; See, I do place you over all the land of Egypt. (Genesis 41:41)
- Then he said to his disciples; It is unavoidable that causes for stumbling should come. Nevertheless, woe to the one through whom they come! (Luke 17:1)
- It would be of more advantage to him if a millstone were suspended from his neck and he were thrown into the sea than for him to stumble one of these little ones. (Luke 17:2)
- And yet then I will confess to them. I never knew You! Get away from me, You workers of lawlessness. (Matthew 7:23)
- But whoever stumbles one of these little ones who put faith in me, it is more beneficial for him to have hung around his neck a millstone such as is turned by an ass and to be sunk in the wide, open sea. (Matthew 18:6)
- And it must occur that when you will have completed reading this book, you will tie to it a stone, and you must pitch it into the midst of the Euphrates. (Jeremiah 51:63)

- She will never be inhabited, nor will she reside for generation after generation. And there the Arab will not pitch his tent, and no shepherds will let their flocks lie down there. (Isaiah 13:20)
- And I will rise up against them, is the utterance of Yehowah of armies. And I will cut off from Babylon name and remnant and progeny and posterity, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Isaiah 14:22)
- Cross over your land like the Nile River, O daughter of Tarshish.
 There is no shipyard any longer. (Isaiah 23:10)
- Come in to her from the farthest part. Open up her granaries. Bank her up, just like those making heaps, and devote her to destruction. May she not come to have any remaining ones. (Jeremiah 50:26)
