- But at this time, brothers, if I should come speaking to **YOU** in tongues, what good would I do **YOU** unless I spoke to **YOU** either with a revelation or with knowledge or with a prophecy or with a teaching? (**1 Corinthians 14:6**)
- And all the brothers with me, to the congregations of Galatia. (**Galatians 1:2**)
