- Let the one who has an ear hear what the spirit says to the congregations; To him that conquers I will give some of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white pebble, and upon the pebble a new name written which no one knows except the one receiving it. (**Revelation 2:17**)
- Let the one who has an ear hear what the spirit says to the congregations. (**Revelation 2:29**)

- Because everything that **has** been born from God **conquers** the world. And this is the conquest that **has** conquered the world, our faith. (**1 John 5:4**)
- Everlasting **life** to those who are seeking glory and honor and incorruptibleness by endurance in work that is good. (**Romans 2:7**)
- Do not be afraid of the things you are about to suffer. Look! The Devil **will** keep on throwing some of **you** into prison that **you** may be fully put to the test, and that **you** may have tribulation ten days. Prove yourself faithful even to death, and I **will** give you the crown of **life**. (**Revelation 2:10**)
- For the **ear** itself makes a test of words, just as the palate tastes when eating. (**Job 34:3**)
- At that time the righteous ones **will** shine as brightly as the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let him that **has ears** listen. (**Matthew 13:43**)
- Whoever **has ears** to listen, let him listen. (**Mark 4:23**)
- Let the one who **has an ear hear what the spirit says to the congregations**. (**Revelation 3:22**)
- And I saw **what** seemed to be a glassy sea mingled with fire, and those who come off victorious from the wild beast and from its image and from the number of its name standing by the glassy sea, having harps of God. (**Revelation 15:2**)
- Down the middle of its broad way. And on this side of the river and on that side there were **trees of life** producing twelve crops of fruit, yielding their fruits each month. And the leaves of the **trees** were for the curing of the nations. (**Revelation 22:2**)
