Revelation 6:13. And the stars of heaven fell to the earth, as when a fig tree shaken by a high wind casts its unripe figs.

[3] - References:

- And the fading flower of its decoration of beauty that is upon the head of the fertile valley must become like the early fig before summer, that, when the seer sees it, while it is yet in his palm, he swallows it down. (Isaiah 28:4)
- All your fortified places are as fig trees with the first ripe fruits, which, if they get wiggled, will certainly fall into the mouth of an eater. (Nahum 3:12)
- Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. (Matthew 24:29)
- However, the inspired utterance says definitely that in later periods of time some will fall away from the faith, paying attention to misleading inspired utterances and teachings of demons. (1 Timothy 4:1)
- By the hypocrisy of men who speak lies, marked in their conscience as with a branding iron. (1 Timothy 4:2)
- Forbidding to marry, commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be partaken of with thanksgiving by those who have faith and accurately know the truth. (1 Timothy 4:3)
- The reason for this is that every creation of God is fine, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving. (1 Timothy 4:4)
- Always learning and yet never able to come to an accurate knowledge of truth. (2 Timothy 3:7)
- The sun itself will be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the coming of the great and fear-inspiring day of Yehowah. (Joel 2:31)
- And it must occur that everyone who calls on the name of Yehowah will get away safe, for in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there will prove to be the escaped ones, just as Yehowah has

said, and in among the survivors, whom Yehowah is calling. (Joel 2:32)
