

~ABHORRENT (57)

[English, repugnant, objectionable, repulsive, detestable, hateful, tasteful, disgusting, Opposite of, **desirable**]

- Certain sexual practices can also be **abhorrent** and we must therefore hate the very idea of doing them.
- And where a man takes his brother's wife, it is something **abhorrent**. It is the nakedness of his brother that he has laid bare. They should become childless. (**Leviticus 20:21**)
- Ezekiel warns that wicked one's who have ignored Yehowah's judgments will, when his destruction comes find that the thing that they loved so much, their gold and silver, to be an **abhorrent** thing, something that they have stumbled over, and which is unable to save them.
- Into the streets they will throw their very silver, and an **abhorrent** thing their own gold will become. Neither their silver nor their gold will be able to deliver them in the day of Yehowah's fury. Their souls they will not satisfy, and their intestines they will not fill, for it has become a stumbling block causing their error. (**Ezekiel 7:19**)
- People take pride in their wealth and their means of adornment and they idolize their possessions, and yet Yehowah will turn them into an **abhorrent** thing.
- And the decoration of one's ornament, one has set it as reason for pride, and their detestable images, their disgusting things, they have made with it. That is why I will make it to them an **abhorrent** thing. (**Ezekiel 7:20**)
- This scripture refers to putting idol worship into a hole and thus covering it up. Then sin also would be done away with along with false prophets.
- In that day there will come to be a well opened to the house of David and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem for sin and for an **abhorrent** thing. (**Zechariah 13:1**)
- And it must occur in that day, is the utterance of Yehowah of

armies, that I shall cut off the names of the idols out of the land, and they will no more be remembered, and also the prophets and the spirit of uncleanness I shall cause to pass out of the land. (Zechariah 13:2)

- Paul here counsels Titus that when Christians were in the world before we became Christians we were hateful creatures, being led away to badness and envy and hating one another, lacking in love for love is the antonym of Abhor
- For even we were once senseless, disobedient, being misled, being slaves to various desires and pleasures, carrying on in badness and envy, abhorrent, hating one another. (Titus 3:3)
