~ABILITY (118)

[English, aptitude, skill, capability, capacity, facility, talent, gift or knack, opposite of, inability]

- Yehowah as the creator of the earth and everything upon it certainly possesses abilities that mere men do not even understand, and that they themselves do not have.
- Your right hand, O Yehowah, is proving itself powerful in ability, Your right hand, O Yehowah, can shatter an enemy. (Exodus 15:6)
- Men can lose their capacity to do certain things that they are normally able to do. Since Yehowah is the giver of all of our abilities as our creator he can also take certain ability away from one's who misuse them.
- As for those remaining among you, I shall certainly bring timidity into their hearts in the lands of their enemies, and the sound of a leaf driven about will indeed chase them away, and they will actually flee as in flight from a sword and fall without anyone chasing. (Leviticus 26:36)
- And they will certainly stumble against one another as if from before a sword without anyone chasing, and for you there will prove to be no ability to stand in resistance before your enemies. (Leviticus 26:37)
- And the men of Ai began to turn back and look, and there the smoke of the city ascended to the heavens, and there proved to be no ability in them to flee this way or that. And the people that were fleeing to the wilderness turned upon the pursuers. (Joshua 8:20)
- We should also make use of our God given ability in God's service
- And their brothers, heads of the house of their forefathers, a thousand seven hundred and sixty, mighty men of ability for the work of the service of the house of the true God. (1 Chronicles 9:13)

- Yehowah's ability is virtually unlimited. Since he has made all things existing, there is nothing that he does not have the ability to control.
- Yours, O Yehowah, are the greatness and the mightiness and the beauty and the excellency and the dignity, for everything in the heavens and in the earth is yours. Yours is the kingdom, O Yehowah, the One also lifting yourself up as head over all. (1 Chronicles 29:11)
- The riches and the glory are on account of you, and you are dominating everything, and in your hand there are power and mightiness, and in your hand is ability to make great and to give strength to all. (1 Chronicles 29:12)
- The Proverbs state that a man of shrewdness who wants to grow in wisdom and knowledge and thinking ability will treasure the wisdom of the Bible.
- To give to the inexperienced one's shrewdness, to a young man knowledge and thinking ability. (Proverbs 1:4)
- Thinking ability itself will keep guard over you, discernment itself will safeguard you. (Proverbs 2:11)
- My son, may they not get away from your eyes. Safeguard practical wisdom and thinking ability. (Proverbs 3:21)
- Daniel and his three companions, there in the court of the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar, demonstrated ability to stand among other members of his court.
- Children in whom there was no defect at all, but good in appearance and having insight into all wisdom and being acquainted with knowledge, and having discernment of what is known, in whom also there was ability to stand in the palace of the king, and to teach them the writing and the tongue of the Chaldeans. (Daniel 1:4)
- Jesus parable of the talents showed that we must grow our abilities, the gifts given to us by our God, and use them to increase his interests here on earth.
- And to one he gave five talents, to another two, to still another

one, to each one according to his own ability, and he went abroad. (Matthew 25:15)

- Paul showed that he had the ability to hope for better things, but not necessarily the ability to bring them about
- For I know that in me, that is, in my flesh, there dwells nothing good, for ability to wish is present with me, but ability to work out what is fine is not present. (Romans 7:18)
- Paul also showed that God gives to his servants ability to speak and knowledge necessary for them to accomplish their ministry.
- That in everything you have been enriched in him, in full ability to speak and in full knowledge. (1 Corinthians 1:5)
- Paul also commended certain Christians who expended themselves beyond their own ability when they heard of the genuine need that their Christian brothers had.
- For according to their actual ability, yes, I testify, beyond their actual ability this was. (2 Corinthians 8:3)
- Paul prayed for godly assistance that the ability to speak and to give a fine witness, may be given me with freeness of speech.
- Also for me, that ability to speak may be given me with the opening of my mouth, with freeness of speech to make known the sacred secret of the Good News. (Ephesians 6:19)
