

~ABUNDANTLY (88)

[English, in abundance, plentifully, copiously, richly, profusely, lavishly]

- Many times in the past God's people have **abundantly** brought in their offerings in expression of their deep love and gratitude.
- And as soon as the word broke forth, the sons of Israel increased the firstfruits of the grain, new wine, and oil and honey and all the produce of the field, and the tenth of everything they brought in **abundantly**. (2 Chronicles 31:5)
- Yehowah gives rain **abundantly** to feed his people.
- So that the clouds trickle, they drip upon mankind **abundantly**. (Job 36:28)
- People who do not fear God shed **abundant** derision upon his people.
- **Abundantly** our soul has been gluttoned with the derision of those who are at ease, of the contempt on the part of the arrogant ones. (Psalms 123:4)
- Yehowah **abundantly** showed his redemption of his people by bringing them back to his service many times.
- Let Israel keep waiting for Yehowah. For there is loving-kindness with Yehowah, and **abundantly** so is there redemption with him. (Psalms 130:7)
- Christians can **abundantly** refresh the spirit of their brothers and comfort them.
- That is why we have been comforted. However, in addition to our comfort we rejoiced still more **abundantly** due to the joy of Titus, because his spirit has been refreshed by all of you. (2 Corinthians 7:13)
- Yehowah **abundantly** supplies **seed** for physical eating and also for spiritual regeneration.

- Now he that **abundantly** supplies seed to the sower and bread for eating will supply and multiply the seed for you to sow and will increase the products of your righteousness. (**2 Corinthians 9:10**)
- Paul's ministration for the Holy one's in Jerusalem was to **abundantly** supply the wants of the holy one's and to increase thanksgiving among his people.
- Because the ministry of this public service is not only to supply **abundantly** the wants of the holy one's but also to be rich with many expressions of thanks to God. (**2 Corinthians 9:12**)
- Paul often allowed a spiritually strong congregation to **abundantly** support his ministry in a new area.
- And yet when I was present with you and I fell in need, I did not become a burden to a single one, for the brothers that came from Macedonia **abundantly** supplied my deficiency. Yes, in every way I kept myself unburdensome to you and will keep myself so. (**2 Corinthians 11:9**)
- Paul showed more **abundantly** his love for his Christian brothers by expending himself in their behalf.
- For my part I will most gladly spend and be completely spent for your souls. If I love you the more **abundantly**, am I to be loved the less? (**2 Corinthians 12:15**)
- God wants his people to be **abundantly** confident in his promises showing deep faith.
- In this manner God, when he purposed to demonstrate more **abundantly** to the heirs of the promise the unchangeableness of his counsel, stepped in with an oath. (**Hebrews 6:17**)
- Some things are **abundantly** clear or as we might say today crystal clear.
- And it is still more **abundantly** clear that with a similarity to Melchizedek there arises another priest. (**Hebrews 7:15**)
