~ABUSIVE (53)

[English, rude, insulting, foul, offensive, obnoxious, violent, cruel, the opposite is, cordial]

- Men's abusive words mean little, fear Yehowah.
- Listen to me, you the one's knowing righteousness, the people in whose heart is my law. Do not be afraid of the reproach of mortal men, and do not be struck with terror just because of their abusive words. (Isaiah 51:7)
- Moab and Ammon were brother nations to Israel and should have been on friendly terms and not spoken abusive talk against Israel.
- I have heard the reproach by Moab and the abusive words of the sons of Ammon, with which they have reproached my people and kept putting on great airs against their territory. (Zephaniah 2:8)
- Christians are counseled that all forms of wrath anger and abusive speech should not be a part of their lives.
- Let all malicious bitterness and anger and wrath and screaming and abusive speech be taken away from you along with all badness. (Ephesians 4:31)
- But now really put them all away from you, wrath, anger, badness, abusive speech, and obscene talk out of your mouth. (Colossians 3:8)
- People who are puffed up with pride but really not possessing understanding are prone to abusive speech.
- He is puffed up with pride, not understanding anything, but being mentally diseased over questionings and debates about words. From these things spring envy, strife, abusive speeches, wicked suspicions. (1 Timothy 6:4)
- · Angels respect Yehowah and honor his true servants and so that refrain from abusive speech even when it is warranted, but they wait upon Yehowah.
- Whereas angels, although they are greater in strength and

power, do not bring against them an accusation in abusive terms, not doing so out of respect for Yehowah. (2 Peter 2:11)

But when Michael the archangel had a difference with the Devil and was disputing about Moses body, he did not dare to bring a judgment against him in abusive terms, but said; May Yehowah rebuke you. (Jude 1:9)
