[English, precisely, exactly, correctly, truthfully, truly, perfectly Opposite of, inaccurately]

- Those in positions of authority have a responsibility to always gain accurate knowledge of any situation they are responsible for.
- Now, therefore, you together with the Sanhedrin make it clear to the military commander why he should bring him down to you as though you intended to determine more accurately the matters involving him. But before he gets near we will be ready to do away with him. (Acts of Apostles 23:15)
- However, Felix, knowing quite accurately the matters concerning this Way, began to put the men off and said; Whenever Lysias the military commander comes down, I shall decide upon these matters involving you. (Acts of Apostles 24:22)
- Paul showed that his present knowledge was like the image produced by a metal mirror, but that it would become accurately known in time just like he was already accurately known now by God.
- For at present we see in hazy outline by means of a metal mirror, but then it will be face to face. At present I know partially, but then I shall know accurately even as I am accurately known. (1 Corinthians 13:12)
- The Christian way is one of accurately knowing the truth about God and his Christ.
- Which has presented itself to you, even as it is bearing fruit and increasing in all the world just as it is doing also among you, from the day you heard and accurately knew the undeserved kindness of God in truth. (Colossians 1:6)
- Forbidding to marry, commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be partaken of with thanksgiving by those who have faith and accurately know the truth. (1 Timothy 4:3)
- Knowing the truth accurately also brings responsibility upon us to uphold it.

For it would have been better for them not to have accurately known the path of righteousness than after knowing it accurately to turn away from the holy commandment delivered to them. (2 Peter 2:21)
