~ADDAR 2 (28) (Ad'dar)

- A southern border town of Judah located near Kadesh-barnea.
- And it went out southward to the ascent of Akrabbim and passed over to Zin and went up from the south to Kadesh-barnea and passed over to Hezron and went up to Addar and went around to Karka. (Joshua 15:3)
- In Joshua's account it is listed as lying between Hezron and Karka, but at;
- And your boundary must change direction from the south of the ascent of Akrabbim and cross over to Zin, and its termination must prove to be on the south of Kadesh-barnea, and it must go out to Hazar-addar and pass over to Azmon. (Numbers 34:4)
- It appears that the name Hezron, meaning, Courtyard,
 Settlement, is combined with Addar to form Hazar-addar, since the
 accounts are parallel. The book Biblical Archaeology (by G. E. Wright, 1963, p.
 71) suggests as a possible location that of `Ain el-Qudeirat, where a
 perennial spring waters a small but fertile valley. It lies about 8
 kilometers (5 miles) North-Northwest of `Ain Qedeis, the possible
 location of Kadesh-barnea.
