(Ad'don)

- Apparently an unidentified location in Babylonia, from which some returning to Jerusalem in **537 B.C.E.**, at the end of the 70-year desolation of Judah, were unable to establish their genealogy from the public records. As a consequence, they were disqualified from serving in the priesthood. Some scholars think **Addon** was an individual who was unable to prove his ancestry.
- And these were the one's going up from Tel-melah, Tel-harsha, Cherub, **Addon** and Immer, and they proved unable to tell the house of their fathers and their origin, whether they were of Israel. (**Ezra 2:59**)
- The sons of Delaiah, the sons of Tobiah, the sons of Nekoda, six hundred and fifty-two. (**Ezra 2:60**)
- And of the sons of the priests, the sons of Habaiah, the sons of Hakkoz, the sons of Barzillai, who took a wife from the daughters of Barzillai the Gileadite and came to be called by their name. (**Ezra 2:61**)
- These were the ones that looked for their register to establish their genealogy publicly, and they did not find themselves, so that they were barred as polluted from the priesthood. (**Ezra 2:62**)
- And these were the one's going up from Tel-melah, Tel-harsha, Cherub, **Addon** and Immer, and they were not able to tell the house of their fathers and their origin, whether they were of Israel: (**Nehemiah 7:61**)
- The sons of Delaiah, the sons of Tobiah, the sons of Nekoda, six hundred and forty-two. (**Nehemiah 7:62**)
- And of the priests, the sons of Habaiah, the sons of Hakkoz, the sons of Barzillai, who took a wife from the daughters of Barzillai the Gileadite and came to be called by their name. (**Nehemiah 7:63**)
- These were the ones that looked for their register, to establish
