

## **~ADMONISH (26)**

**[English, reprove, caution, warn about, reprimand, rebuke, reproach]**

- Christian brothers are counseled to **admonish** one another for their goal should be to see all reach maturity.
- Now I myself also am persuaded about you, my brothers, that you yourselves are also full of goodness, as you have been filled with all knowledge, and that you can also **admonish** one another. (**Romans 15:14**)
- Paul **admonished** his Christian brothers not to shame them but to help them reach maturity.
- I am writing these things, not to shame you, but to **admonish** you as my beloved children. (**1 Corinthians 4:14**)
- To **admonish** the disorderly was a way to keep order among the congregations.
- On the other hand, we exhort you, brothers, **admonish** the disorderly, speak consolingly to the depressed souls, support the weak, be long-suffering toward all. (**1 Thessalonians 5:14**)
