

~ADRAMYTTIUM (25)
(Ad-ra-myt'ti-um)

- A seaport city on the Aegean Sea, located in Mysia at the Northwest corner of Asia Minor, North of Pergamum. In modern Turkey the inland town of Edremit, East of the harbor, preserves the earlier name.
- **Adramyttium** was part of the province of Asia under Roman rule and was evidently at one time a maritime commercial center of some importance, since it lay on the Roman road that passed through Pergamum and Ephesus to the South and Assos, Troas, and the Hellespont to the West and North. It is likely that Paul passed through **Adramyttium** on his third missionary tour. The only direct Bible reference to the place, however, is at;
- Going aboard a boat from **Adramyttium** that was about to sail to places along the coast of the district of Asia, we set sail, there being with us Aristarchus a Macedonian from Thessalonica. (**Acts of Apostles 27:2**)
- At Caesarea, Paul, as a prisoner in the custody of the Roman officer Julius, boarded a ship from **Adramyttium**.
