~ADRIA (25) (A'dri-a)

- Now as the fourteenth night fell and we were being tossed to and fro on the sea of Adria, at midnight the sailors began to suspect they were drawing near to some land. (Acts of Apostles 27:27)
- Reference is made to the sea of Adria, in which Paul spent 14 turbulent days before being shipwrecked on the island of Malta. Strabo says this name is derived from the city of Atria, located at the mouth of the Po River on what is now called the Gulf of Venice. [Geography, 5, I, 8]
- The present Italian city of Adria lies somewhat back from the coast. It appears that the name Adria came to apply to the waters in that vicinity and was progressively extended to include all the present Adriatic Sea, the Ionian Sea, and those waters of the Mediterranean East of Sicily, and Malta, and West of Crete.
- So the name covered some waters that today are considered as outside the Adriatic Sea, but in Paul's day the island of Malta could properly be said to be bounded by the sea of Adria.
