~ADVANCE (115)

[English, go forward, move forward, press forward, move on, proceed, progress]

- Often one goes out in advance of another to clear a way for him similar to the way a scout works
- Later on he said; Let us pull out and go, and let me go in advance of you. (Genesis 33:12)
- And he sent Judah in advance of him to Joseph to impart information ahead of him to Goshen. After that they came into the land of Goshen. (Genesis 46:28)
- But as for you, young child, you will be called a prophet of the Most High, for you will go in advance before Yehowah to make his ways ready. (Luke 1:76)
- So he sent forth messengers in advance of him. And they went their way and entered into a village of Samaritans, to make preparation for him. (Luke 9:52)
- After these things the Lord designated seventy others and sent them forth by twos in advance of him into every city and place to which he himself was going to come. (Luke 10:1)
- And those going in advance began to tell him sternly to keep quiet, but that much more he kept shouting; Son of David, have mercy on me. (Luke 18:39)
- Sometimes advance means to get out in front of a situation
- So he ran ahead to an advance position and climbed a figmulberry tree in order to see him, because he was about to go through that way. (Luke 19:4)
- You yourselves bear me witness that I said; I am not the Christ, but, I have been sent forth in advance of that one. (John 3:28)
- The prophets were sent in advance of the fulfillment of God's promises so that men would know from where blessing came.

- Yes, they killed those who made announcement in advance concerning the coming of the righteous One, whose betrayers and murderers you have now become. (Acts of Apostles 7:52)
- John The Baptist went in advance of the Christ to prepare a people for Yehowah.
- After John, in advance of the entry of that One, had preached publicly to all the people of Israel baptism in symbol of repentance. (Acts of Apostles 13:24)
- Paul encouraged Christians to get ready in advance their gift so that it should not appear to be something extorted.
- Therefore I thought it necessary to encourage the brothers to come to you in advance and to get ready in advance your bountiful gift previously promised, that thus this might be ready as a bountiful gift and not as something extorted. (2 Corinthians 9:5)
- Paul gave counsel through his letters in advance of his coming in person so that things might really be right when he came to visit them.
- I have said previously and, as if present the second time and yet absent now, I say in advance to those who have sinned before and to all the rest, that if ever I come again I will not spare. (2 Corinthians 13:2)
- The scripture saw things in advance and foresaw things not yet revealed explicitly.
- Now the Scripture, seeing in advance that God would declare people of the nations righteous due to faith, declared the Good News beforehand to Abraham, namely: By means of you all the nations will be blessed. (Galatians 3:8)
- The Holy Spirit is a token in advance of anointed Christians heavenly spiritual inheritance.
- Which is a token in advance of our inheritance, for the purpose of releasing by a ransom God's own possession, to his glorious praise. (Ephesians 1:14)

- God prepared good works as the way Christians should walk in advance of their actually coming forth.
- For we are a product of his work and were created in union with Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared in advance for us to walk in them. (Ephesians 2:10)
- Paul counseled Timothy that wicked men would advance from bad to worse conduct.
- But shun empty speeches that violate what is holy, for they will advance to more and more ungodliness. (2 Timothy 2:16)
- But wicked men and impostors will advance from bad to worse,
 misleading and being misled. (2 Timothy 3:13)
- Paul counseled that Christian should not be led away to wicked conduct for they have advance knowledge of truth.
- You, therefore, beloved ones, having this advance knowledge, be on your guard that you may not be led away with them by the error of the law-defying people and fall from your own steadfastness. (2 Peter 3:17)
