~AFFLICTION (179)

[English, suffering, difficulty, burden, problem, hardship, pain, trouble, misery]

- Yehowah saw the affliction of his people down in Egypt.
- And Yehowah added; Unquestionably I have seen the affliction of my people who are in Egypt, and I have heard their outcry as a result of those who drive them to work, because I well know the pains they suffer. (Exodus 3:7)
- And so I say; I shall bring you up out of affliction by the Egyptians to the land of the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, to a land flowing with milk and honey. (Exodus 3:17)
- At this the people believed. When they heard that Yehowah had turned his attention to the sons of Israel and that he had seen their affliction, then they bowed down and prostrated themselves. (Exodus 4:31)
- You must eat nothing leavened along with it for seven days. You should eat along with it unfermented cakes, the bread of affliction, because it was in haste that you came out of the land of Egypt, that you may remember the day of your coming out of the land of Egypt all the days of your life. (Deuteronomy 16:3)
- And we began to cry out to Yehowah the God of our forefathers, and Yehowah proceeded to hear our voice and to look on our affliction and our trouble and our oppression. (Deuteronomy 26:7)
- So you saw the affliction of our forefathers in Egypt, and their outcry at the Red Sea you heard. (Nehemiah 9:9)
- Hannah prayed to Yehowah to end her affliction of barrenness.
- And she went on to make a vow and say; O Yehowah of armies, if you will without fail look upon the affliction of your slave girl and actually remember me, and you will not forget your slave girl and actually give to your slave girl a male offspring, I will give him to Yehowah all the days of his life, and no razor will come

upon his head. (1 Samuel 1:11)

- Yehowah appointed Saul to end the affliction of his people by the Philistines.
- Tomorrow about this time I shall send to you a man from the land of Benjamin, and you must anoint him as leader over my people Israel, and he must save my people from the hand of the Philistines, because I have seen the affliction of my people, for their outcry has come to me. (1 Samuel 9:16)
- Abiathar was preserved because he had suffered affliction alongside of David.
- And to Abiathar the priest the king said; Go to Anathoth to your fields! For you are deserving of death, but on this day I shall not put you to death, because you carried the ark of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah before David my father, and because you suffered affliction during all the time that my father suffered affliction. (1 Kings 2:26)
- Israel as a nation was afflicted without any helper.
- For Yehowah had seen the very bitter affliction of Israel. There was neither any helpless one nor any worthless one, nor was there a helper for Israel. (2 Kings 14:26)
- David during his affliction saved massive sums of gold and silver for Yehowah's temple.
- And here during my affliction I have prepared for Yehowah's house a hundred thousand talents of gold and a million talents of silver, and the copper and the iron there is no means of weighing because they have come to be in such quantity, and timbers and stones I have prepared, but to them you will make additions. (1 Chronicles 22:14)
- Job suffered affliction more than any other man of his time.
- If I am actually in the wrong, too bad for me! And if I am actually in the right, I may not raise my head, glutted with dishonor and saturated with affliction. (Job 10:15)
- And now my soul is poured out within me, days of affliction take

- hold upon me. (**Job 30:16**)
- My own intestines were made to boil and did not keep silent, days of affliction confronted me. (Job 30:27)
- And if they are bound in fetters, they are captured with ropes of affliction. (Job 36:8)
- He will rescue the afflicted one in his affliction, and he will uncover their ear in the oppression. (Job 36:15)
- Be on your guard that you do not turn to what is hurtful, for this you have chosen rather than affliction. (Job 36:21)
- Yehowah shows favor to his Messiah under affliction.
- Show me favor, O Yehowah, see my affliction by those hating me, o you who are lifting me up from the gates of death. (Psalms 9:13)
- Yehowah is close by to the one's under affliction.
- For he has neither despised nor loathed the affliction of the afflicted one, and he has not concealed his face from him, and when he cried to him for help he heard. (Psalms 22:24)
- See my affliction and my trouble, and pardon all my sins. (Psalms 25:18)
- I will be joyful and rejoice in your loving-kindness, in that you have seen my affliction. You have known about the distresses of my soul. (Psalms 31:7)
- Why do you keep your very face concealed? Why do you forget our affliction and our oppression? (Psalms 44:24)
- My own eye has languished because of my affliction. I have called on you, O Yehowah, all day long, to you I have spread out my palms. (Psalms 88:9)
- There were those dwelling in darkness and deep shadow, prisoners in affliction and irons. (Psalms 107:10)
- The foolish one's cause themselves affliction.

- Those who were foolish, due to the way of their transgression and due to their errors, finally caused themselves affliction. (Psalms 107:17)
- Yehowah watches over the afflicted ones.
- But he protects the poor one from affliction and converts him into families just like a flock. (Psalms 107:41)
- Yehowah's word is a great comfort in affliction.
- This is my comfort in my affliction, for your own saying has preserved me alive. (Psalms 119:50)
- Before I was under affliction I was sinning by mistake, but now I have kept your very saying; (Psalms 119:67)
- If your Law had not been what I am fond of, then I should have perished in my affliction. (Psalms 119:92)
- O see my affliction, and rescue me, for I have not forgotten your own law. (Psalms 119:153)
- That one may not drink and forget what is decreed and pervert the cause of any of the sons of affliction. (Proverbs 31:5)
- The way of Yehowah's discipline is to allow affliction for it refines his sons like silver.
- Look! I have refined you, but not in the form of silver. I have made choice of you in the smelting furnace of affliction. (Isaiah 48:10)
- Paul showed that despite great affliction he suffered his joy was not reduced.
- I have great freeness of speech toward you. I have great boasting in regard to you. I am filled with comfort, I am overflowing with joy in all our affliction. (2 Corinthians 7:4)
- That during a great test under affliction their abundance of joy and their deep poverty made the riches of their generosity abound. (2 Corinthians 8:2)
