

~AGREEABLY (29)

[English, pleasantly, enjoyably, delightfully, pleasurable, comfortably,
Opposite of, **unpleasantly**]

- If a man found no delight in a woman after marrying her, he could send her away provided it was **agreeable** to her own soul.
- And it must occur that if you have found no delight in her, you must then send her away, **agreeably** to her own soul, but you must by no means sell her for money. You must not deal tyrannically with her after you have humiliated her. (**Deuteronomy 21:14**)
- Joseph was appointed by Pharaoh to bind his princes **agreeably** to his soul and to teach wisdom.
- To bind his princes **agreeably** to his soul and that he might teach wisdom to even his elderly men. (**Psalms 105:22**)
- Yehowah declared wicked men who had **agreed** to let go their Hebrew slaves and then went back on their word.
- Then you turn back and profane my name and bring back each one his man-servant and each one his maidservant, whom you let go free **agreeably** to their soul, and you subject them to become your menservants and maidservants. (**Jeremiah 34:16**)
