[English, allowable, permissible, permitted, acceptable, tolerable, Opposite of, unacceptable]

- Rachael said that they were not allowed to water the sheep until the stone was rolled away from the well.
- To this they said, We are not allowed to do so until all the droves are gathered and they actually roll away the stone from off the mouth of the well. Then we must water the sheep. (Genesis 29:8)
- God did not allow tricky Laban to defraud Jacob.
- And your father has trifled with me and he has changed my wages ten times, but God has not allowed him to do me harm. (Genesis 31:7)
- Moses stated that not a hoof was allowed to remain in Egypt of their herds.
- And our livestock will also go with us. Not a hoof will be allowed to remain, because it is from them that we shall take some to worship Yehowah our God, and we ourselves do not know what we shall render in worship to Yehowah until our arriving there. (Exodus 10:26)
- Yehowah showed that Israel would not be allowed to finish off the nations of Canaan quickly.
- And Yehowah your God will certainly push these nations away from before you little by little. You will not be allowed to finish them off quickly, for fear the wild beasts of the field may multiply against you. (Deuteronomy 7:22)
- Israelites were not allowed to eat the tenth parts anywhere except before Yehowah.
- You will not be allowed to eat inside your gates the tenth part of your grain or of your new wine or of your oil or the firstborn one's of your herd and of your flock or any of your vow offerings that you will vow or your voluntary offerings or the contribution

of your hand. (Deuteronomy 12:17)

- Neither were they allowed to eat the Passover in any city that they chose.
- You will not be allowed to sacrifice the Passover in any one of your cities that Yehowah your God is giving you. (Deuteronomy 16:5)
- Israel would not be allowed choose their own king, but Yehowah would. Neither would they be allowed to have a foreigner sit as king.
- You should without fail set over yourself a king whom Yehowah your God will choose. From among your brothers you should set a king over yourself. You will not be allowed to put over yourself a foreigner who is not your brother. (Deuteronomy 17:15)
- A man with more than one wife was not allowed to put the beloved son ahead of the hated one.
- It must also occur that in the day that he gives as an inheritance to his sons what he happens to have, he will not be allowed to constitute the son of the loved one his firstborn at the expense of the hated one's son, the firstborn. (Deuteronomy 21:16)
- An Israelite finding a lost possession was not allowed to withdraw but must find the owner and return the property.
- That is the way too that you will do with his ass, and that is the way you will do with his mantle, and that is the way you will do with anything lost of your brothers, which gets lost from him and which you have found. You will not be allowed to withdraw yourself. (Deuteronomy 22:3)
- A man falsely accusing his wife of notorious deeds would not be allowed to divorce her all his days.
- And they must fine him a hundred silver shekels and give them to the girl's father, because he brought forth a bad name upon a virgin of Israel, and she will continue to be his wife. He will not be allowed to divorce her all his days. (Deuteronomy 22:19)
- A man lying down with a non-engaged virgin must take her as wife and will not be allowed to divorce her all his days.

- The man who lay down with her must also give the girl's father fifty silver shekels, and she will become his wife due to the fact that he humiliated her. He will not be allowed to divorce her all his days. (Deuteronomy 22:29)
- Upon divorcing a woman a man would not be allowed to take her back.
- The first owner of her who dismissed her will not be allowed to take her back again to become his wife after she has been defiled, for that is something detestable before Yehowah, and you must not lead the land that Yehowah your God is giving you as an inheritance into sin. (Deuteronomy 24:4)
- Moses at 120 years of age was not allowed by God to continue living, and leading his people.
- And said to them; A hundred and twenty years old I am today. I shall no more be allowed to go out and come in, as Yehowah has said to me; You will not cross this Jordan. (Deuteronomy 31:2)
- Joshua made a covenant with the Gibeonites and so was not allowed to hurt them.
- At this all the chieftains said to all the assembly; We, for our part, have sworn to them by Yehowah the God of Israel, and now we are not allowed to hurt them. (Joshua 9:19)
- The sons of Israel were not allowed to give their daughters to the sons of Benjamin.
- As for us, we are not allowed to give them wives from our daughters, because the sons of Israel have sworn, saying; Cursed is the one that gives a wife to Benjamin. (Judges 21:18)
- After their exile for seventy years the sons of Israel were allowed to return to their homeland.
- For when you return to Yehowah, your brothers and your sons will be objects of mercy before those holding them captive, and be allowed to return to this land, for Yehowah your God is gracious and merciful, and he will not turn away the face from you if you return to him. (2 Chronicles 30:9)

- No toll or tax was allowed to be imposed on the Levites, priests or musicians of the temple.
- And to you men it is being made known that, as respects any of the priests and the Levites, the musicians, the doorkeepers, the Nethinim, and the workers of this house of God, no tax, tribute or toll is allowed to be imposed upon them. (Ezra 7:24)
- Yehowah will not allow the foot of his righteous one to totter.
- He is setting our soul in life, and he has not allowed our foot to totter. (Psalms 66:9)
- A householder knowing that a thief was coming would stay awake and wait up for him and not allow his house to be broken into.
- But know one thing, that if the householder had known in what watch the thief was coming, he would have kept awake and not allowed his house to be broken into. (Matthew 24:43)
- Moses allowed the writing of a certificate of divorce.
- They said; Moses allowed the writing of a certificate of dismissal and divorcing her. (Mark 10:4)
- Paul asked if he was allowed to say something to the military commander who had him under arrest.
- And as he was about to be led into the soldiers quarters, Paul said to the military commander; Am I allowed to say something to you? He said; Can you speak Greek? (Acts of Apostles 21:37)
