

~ALLURE (58)

- Moses warned about the **allure** of family turning one to false gods.
- In case your brother, the son of your mother, or your son or your daughter or your cherished wife or your companion who is like your own soul, should try to **allure** you in secrecy, saying; Let us go and serve other gods, whom you have not known, neither you nor your forefathers. (**Deuteronomy 13:6**)
- Jehoshaphat was **allured** by Ahab to go up against Ramoth-gilead.
- So years later he went down to Ahab at Samaria, and Ahab proceeded to sacrifice sheep and cattle in abundance for him and for the people that were with him. And he began to **allure** him to go up against Ramoth-gilead. (**2 Chronicles 18:2**)
- Rabshekeh told the Jews not to let Hezekiah **allure** them with false words for not god had been able to stand against Assyria.
- In order, that Hezekiah may not **allure** you, saying; Yehowah himself will deliver us. Have the gods of the nations delivered each one his own land out of the hand of the king of Assyria? (**Isaiah 36:18**)
- And now do not let Hezekiah deceive you or **allure** you like this and do not put faith in him, for no god of any nation or kingdom was able to deliver his people out of my hand and out of the hand of my forefathers. How much less, then, will your own God deliver you out of my hand? (**2 Chronicles 32:15**)
- The apostate will **allure** you from the mouth of distress.
- And he will also certainly **allure** you from the mouth of distress! Broader space, not constraint, will be in its place, and the consolation of your table will be full of fatness. (**Job 36:16**)

- **Man needs to be careful that rage does not **allure** him into spitefulness.**
- **For take care that rage does not **allure** you into spiteful handclapping, and let not a large ransom itself lead you astray. (Job 36:18)**
- **The wicked one's give advice so as to **allure** one from his dignity.**
- **Indeed they give advice so as to **allure** from one's own dignity, they take pleasure in a lie. With their mouth they bless, but inside themselves they call down evil. (Psalms 62:4)**
