(A-ma'nah) [from a root meaning trustworthy, faithful, long-lasting]

- This name appears in the Hebrew at;
- With me from Lebanon, O bride, with me from Lebanon may you come. May you descend from the top of Anti-Lebanon, from the top of Senir, even Hermon, from the lairs of lions, from the mountains of leopards. (Song of Solomon 4:8)
- In connection with Lebanon and Mount Hermon. Most translations simply transliterate the Hebrew word, however, some scholars understand it to refer to the Anti-Lebanon Range, while others apply it to that portion of the Anti-Lebanon's in which the Nahr Barada has its source.
